

Mateer to Present 'Cherry Orchard'

The University's Mateer Playhouse will be one of the first theaters in the country to begin the nation-wide commemoration of Anton Chekhov's 100th birthday with its production of "The Cherry Orchard" which begins Monday at Standing Stone.

Leading members of the cast will include Charlotte Jones in the role of "Madame Ranevskaya," Ronald Bishop as her brother "Gayeff," Esther Benson as her adopted daughter "Varya" and Leon B. Stevens as "Lopahin."

The story concerns the aging and useless Russian aristocrat Madame Ranevskaya and her problems with the changing Russian social order at the turn of the century. Having lost most of her wealth she is faced with the problem of supporting her ex-lover in Paris and protecting herself from encroachment on her social standing by the mysterious Lopahin, a member of the rising merchant class.

In this play Chekhov has presented a candid glimpse of the social problems leading to the Russian Revolution.

According to Harvey Whitten, promotion manager for the playhouse, the play is significant today due to the increased interest in American-Russian contact and the profound influence which Chekhov has had on modern theater. Whitten believes that this play is a rare opportunity for Central Pennsylvania audiences to see such significant theater.

With the introduction of this play Chekhov created a revolution in the theater. His depart-

ure from the stylized and formal acting of the 19th century required the development of an entirely new system of acting—the realistic and natural method which we have today.

Richard Mason, set designer for the playhouse, will have ample opportunity to practice his skill in this production. The play calls for three changes of sets, the first time this has been attempted at Mateer this season.

According to Mason, there will be two indoor scenes and an outdoor scene. An interesting feature of the set will be a real log cabin constructed from timber cut near the playhouse.

Italy's Vocational Program To Receive Teacher Boost

Italy's program of vocationalization of European Economic Co-operation will receive a boost when three Italian university professors return to their native land after spending six months at the University.

The three men—Dr. Vittorio Motroni, Dr. Igino Micheli and Dr. Giovanni Baldan—were enrolled in agricultural and industrial education courses during the Spring Semester and Mid-Session.

After completing their work at Penn State, the trio left for a 45-day tour of the United States which will take them to Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Denver and St. Louis.

The professors are sponsored by the European Productivity Agency, a division of the Organi-

zation. They were selected by the EPA on the basis of their background and training experience. Motroni will begin pilot programs in agriculture education at the University of Sassari, Micheli will begin a similar program at the University of Padua and Baldan will begin an industrial education program at the University of Padua.

"Italy has never before trained teachers to be teachers," Dr. Lewis S. Land, director of vocational teacher education, said, "but merely has used graduates in engineering and agriculture schools as teachers."
