MacAllister Hall Will Finish Service as Women's Dorm

MacAllister Hall will finish its service as a coed residence hall as soon as 90 women are moved to other rooms.

About 90 coeds represent the overload the University usually admits to replace women who leave early in the semester.

Otto Mueller, director of housing, said the hall would be turned over to the University for other uses, possibly office space, as soon as the coeds are transplanted.

Mueller said dining hall service was cut off in the hall last spring and the coeds are now eating in McElwain and Simmons.

According to the housing direc-

tor, no men are now in temporary living quarters, thanks to the completion of the North Halls, housing 1140 men.

Triebold Will Lecture On Artificial Respiration

Patrolmen Protect University Property

The Campus Patrol under the direction of Col. Lucien E. Bolduc and in cooperation with local and state police forces, provides the University with its own police and internal security organization.

With 16 regular patrol members and 34 student patrolmen, the Campus patrol operates 24 hours a day all year to protect University property, direct traffic and enforce parking regulations.

There are five officers under Bolduc. Captain John F. Galaida, an ex-Marine sergeant, is in charge of training the new patrol members. Lt. Robert Stuart, a retired Air Force Major, is the supply officer, Lt. Harold F. Lewis is administrative officer and Captain Philip Mark is traffic violations officer.

Besides their regular duties, all the officers serve as night officers at least once a week.

All the regular patrolmen must attend various schools during the year. During the Christmas vacation, classes are held in first aid and fire fighting techniques. As a result of these schools all regular patrolmen, with the exception of a few new men, have received the standard Red Cross First Aid certificate.

To aid the patrol in covering the campus, it has been supplied with two station wagons and a motorcycle, all radio equipped.

Enforcing the new parking reg-

ulations is probably the most time consuming duty of the patrol. Over 50 major parking areas must be patrolled constantly to make sure that only authorized students and faculty are using the spaces.
