## Fall Enrollment 936 Students Named To Spring Dean's List Will Increase To Over 20,000

The University is expecting a total enrollment of more than 20,000 students this fall, an increase over the 19,869 that registered last year.

Dr. Robert G. Bernreuter, dean of admissions and registrar, said today that the total will include about 15,000 on the main campus, of which about 12,900 will be undergraduates. These figures reflect an increase of about 400 over a year ago.

Activity for the fall semester began with the mass arrival on Sept. 13 of about 4,400 new students who are participating in the annual Orientation Week program. This number includes 3,200 freshmen, 500 transfers from other colleges and universities and 700 transfers from university campuses and centers throughout the State.

Registration began Wednesday and continues through noon today and the first classes of the Monday.

According to latest figures, last year's 100 top national newspaper advertisers invested over \$300 million dollars.

During the Spring Semester, 936 University undergraduates achieved scholastic distinction by qualifying for the Dean's List.

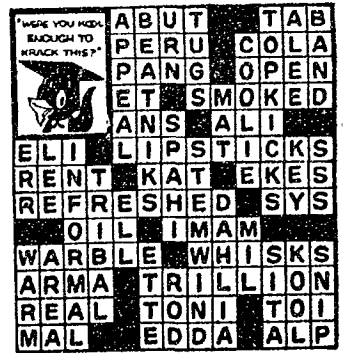
In releasing the list, President Eric A. Walker noted that the total represented 7.1 per cent of the 13,128 full-time undergraduates enrolled on campus and at campuses throughout the state.

Walker also pointed out that 124 of these students completed the semester with a perfect 4.00 average.

## April Completion Expected for HEc

Two new wings, being added to the old Home Economics South Building, are scheduled for completion by April, 1960.

Formerly the Textiles Chemistry Building, the old Home Ec South will have a wing added to both the north and south side. The north wing will be 71 feet wide, 168 feet long and will have three floors. The south wing, to be 81 feet wide and 200 feet long, will have two floors.

There will be a connecting unit between the north wing of the Home Ec South and the original Home Ec Building. The steam tunnel will run beneath the unit.

The new building will be the center for work in fields of textiles, clothing management, family economics, housing, home equipment, home art, child development, family, relationships and commercial con-

sumer services. The first floor of the south wing will hold an infant observation laboratory, research facilities for family relationships and discussion rooms.

Home art and textiles laboratories will be housed in the ground floor of the north wing. On the first floor will be clothing and textile labs, home management research rooms and family economics classrooms.

Household and home management equipment and instruction laboratories will be located on the second floor of the wing. An auditorium to hold 190 persons and a commercial consumer service laboratory will also be located on the second floor.

The original Home Ec South will remain the textiles research lab. On its main floor will be a reference lab, and several offices. The second floor will be occupied by the housing research laboratory.
