plenty of fighting if they want to take a win back to Lexington, Virginia. Sensing their finest season in years, Penn State will be out to gain ground in the national rankings with a win today.

They'll go with just about the same team which opened at Missouri last week. The only question mark is at tackle where Charley Janerette, hampered by a leg injury, may not start. If he doesn't, the nod will go to Andy Stynchula.

Tom Mulraney will be other tackle. The rest of the line has Frank Korbin and Bud Kohlhaas at guards, Jay Huffman at center, and Henry Opperman and Norm Neff at ends.

In the backfield the Lions have Lucas at quarterback, Dick Hoak and Jim Kerr, halfback; Captain Pat Botula at fullback.

That's the same backfield that ran roughshod over Missouri's defense last week. Lucas' passing and running was the key to the Lion win last week. Chosen by Sports Illustrated as Back-of-the-Week, Lucas completed 10 of 11 passes and rushed for 48 yards in seven carries.

His number one receiver was Kerr who went for a touchdown on a 52-yard play.

Galen Hall, who completed three passes in three tries will be the second unit signal caller. His halfbacks will be Dick Pae and Eddie Caye. Sam Sobczak will be at fullback.

The line has John Bozick and Dave Alexander at ends, Bill

Popp and Sam Stelletella at guards, either Janerette or Stynchula will be at one tackle slot and Stew Barber will be at the other. Dick Wilson is the center.

V.M.I. will go with Tom Kurkoski and Dick Evans at ends, Lou Shuba and Bill Haerberlin at guards, Jon Quinn and Marty Caples at tackle and Lee Badgett at center.

The backfield finds Jimmy O'Dell at quarterback, Stinson

Jones and John Traynham at halves and Butch Armistead at fullback.

Besides getting their first look at the Lions and Lucas, Penn State fans will see Rip Engle's new slot formation.

The new formation features two split ends with the halfbacks moving into the tackle-end slots. The formation is designed to shake up the opponents' defense and loosen the secondary.

Hodges Blasts HR To Give LA Win

CHICAGO (AP)—Gil Hodges' 11th inning homer for his third run-batted-in of the game swept the pennant-pursuing Los Angeles Dodgers to a 5-4 victory over the Chicago Cubs yesterday.

Pending Milwaukee's game last night with Philadelphia, the triumph moved the Dodgers into a half-game lead in the down-to-the-wire National League race.

Hodges doubled to drive across two runs in the sixth when Los Angeles took a 4-2 lead.

Wally Moon also homered for Los Angeles in the first. Sammy Taylor and Ernie Banks slammed Cub homers, Banks' No. 45 of the season tying the score at 4-4 in the eighth and sending the game into extra innings.

Larry Sherry, third Dodger pitcher, notched the victory. Starter Don Drysdale, 17-13 was chased over from Danny McDevitt in the 10th, got his sixth victory against two defeats.

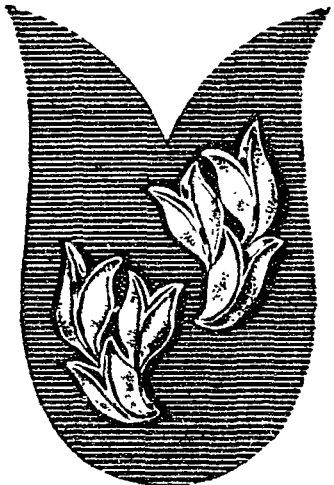
The loser was Bill Henry, who replaced Cub starter Glen Hobbie at the start of the eighth. Henry now has a 9-8 record.

Hodges' decisive blow came as dusk was settling on lightless Wrigley Field. The triumph was only the Dodgers' 10th against as many defeats facing the Cubs this season.

This turned the tables on the Cubs who Tuesday and Wednesday won come-from-behind victories over San Francisco and knocked the Giants out of pennant contention.

BOSTON (AP) — The Boston Traveler yesterday said ailing, aging Red Sox slugger Ted Williams will return as a pinch hitter and spot starter in 1960.

The Traveler said the decision was made last week when Williams, 41, had a closed door meeting with Red Sox owner Tom Yawkey. The Red Sox will announce the decision on the closing day of the season, Sunday, or after the World Series, the newspaper said.

Neither Williams nor Yawkey was immediately available for comment.
