Dioda said he sometimes picked up pieces in his exhibits in an unusual way. The antelope figure was carved from a pillar of a home in Detroit and the base of the tall bird was a chopping block used by a restaurant.

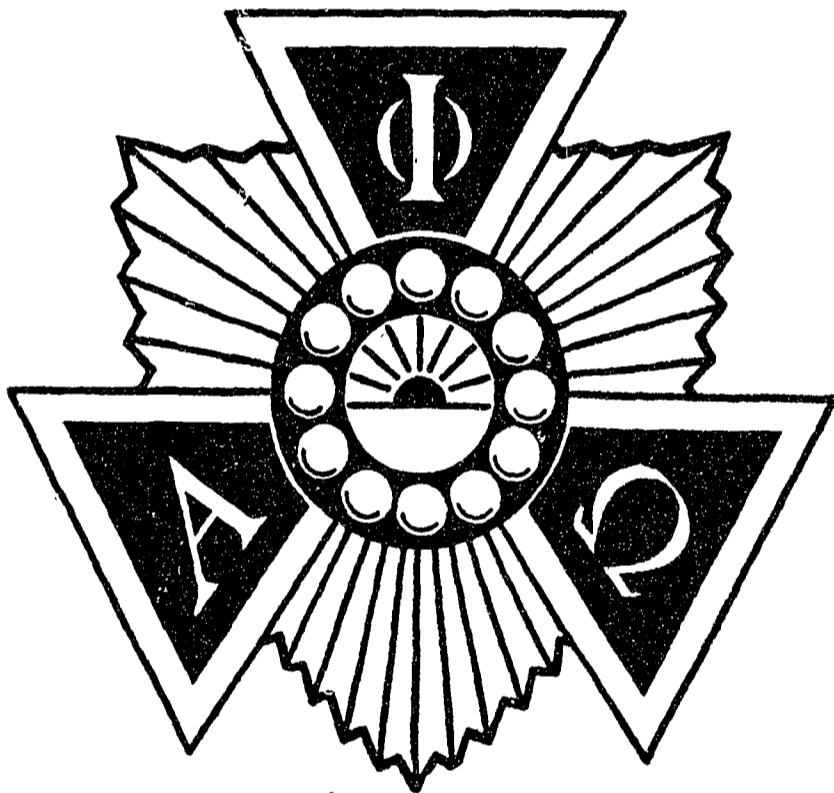
