in the State College area, a good portion of the sun was obscured. An eclipse is caused by the moon passing between the earth and the sun and thus intercepting the sunlight before it can reach the earth.

A total eclipse of the sun, known as an Umbra, was visible in some parts of Massachusetts and New Hampshire and on a path about 150 miles wide across the Atlantic to the Canary Islands, through the Sahara Desert, the Sudan and Ethiopia to the Indian Ocean.

The partial eclipse could be seen all the way from the Caribbean to Greenland and from Michigan to Pakistan.

The last eclipse was on Oct. 12, 1958 and was observed in the South Pacific. The next one will not occur until Feb. 15, 1961 and will not be visible in the United States. It's path will extend from Southern Europe into Asia.

After choosing the harpsichord as the instrument he wished to use in performances, Fuller began studying at the Yale School of Music and later studied abroad for a year.

Last spring Miss Anderson and Fuller were brought together professionally at the Handel Festival of Music and have appeared jointly several times since then.
