

# Braun to Speak at Chapel Service

"Sentimental Journey to Hell" will be the topic of the sermon of the Rev. Theodore Braun, United Church of Christ Chaplain to the University, at the Protestant Service of Worship at 9 a.m. tomorrow in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

Music for the service will be provided by the meditation Chapel Choir, under the direction of James Bach. They will sing as anthem "Give Ear O Lord" by Schiitz. The organist will be Larry Handwerk. The ushers will be members of Phi Lambda Phi.

"Intellectual Critics of Religion" will be the title of a University Christian Association lecture-discussion at 8:30 tonight in the lounge of the Chapel. The guest speaker will be Dr. Holmes Hartshorne, professor of philosophy and religion at Colgate University.

The Westminster Foundation will hold seminars from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m. tomorrow. Topics will include "Basic Christian Beliefs," "Great Themes of the Bible" and "Makers of Modern Protestant Thought."

# Hartshorne to Give Sermon Entitled 'Love and the Devil'

Dr. Holmes Hartshorne, professor of philosophy and religion at Colgate University, will speak at the University Chapel service at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

Hartshorne will speak on the subject "Love and the Devil" using as his sermon text I John 4:7-19. George E. Ceiga, University organist will play "On Melcombe" as the Prelude and "Fugue in B Minor" for the Postlude, both of which were composed by Willan. The Offertory which he will play is "Abide, O Dearest Jesus" by Peeters.

The Chapel Choir, under the direction of Willa Taylor, will sing as choral introt "Sing to the Faith," a book published in 1958, Lord a Joyful Song" by Heinrich Schutz. The anthem will be a setting of Psalm 28 by Alan Hovhanes.

Hartshorne received his bachelor of arts and master of science degrees in philosophy from Williams College in Williamston, Mass. His bachelor of divinity and doctor of theology degrees were granted by Union Theological Seminary in New York.

His various posts include serving as pastor of the Wilmington, Vt., Congregational Church; chaplain at Olivet College in Michigan and professor of religion and dean of the Chapel of Doane College in Nebraska. He joined the Colgate faculty in 1946 as assistant professor of philosophy and religion. He is the author of "The Promise of Science and the Power of Faith," a book published in 1958, as well as numerous articles and reviews.
