

Placement Annuals To Be Distributed

Copies of the College Placement Annual are now being distributed to seniors and graduate students in 112 Old Main.

The Annual lists the job opportunities in 1700 companies. It is being distributed in 600 colleges and universities.

In 1959-60 engineers will be the most in demand among the company recruiters. Close to two-thirds of the companies listed in the Annual are interested in hiring some type of engineer, and cumulative totals show more than 3600 company openings for engineers.

Mechanical engineers will be the most popular—some 800 companies list openings for them—but electrical and electronic engineering are close behind. The third most desirable man will be the chemist.

Fields with futures, as measured by the number wanting personnel in those categories, are selling, 613; accounting, 516; chemical engineering, 472; and business administration, 459. Industrial engineers, though still sought after, found the demand for their services falling slightly, from 481 last year to 431. The number of firms seeking mathematicians and electronic computing personnel continued to increase.

Examining the openings for women graduates, the Annual contains a special listing of those firms which offer professional employment to women. The job opportunities range from accounting to aerodynamics and from probation work to dentistry.

Articles in the opening section of the Annual give tips on all aspects of recruiting and job-hunting. The article "Placing the Experienced Alumnus" was written

by Donald Cook, head of the placement division at the University. It concerns the opportunities the placement office offers to the alumnus and explains procedures and considerations the alumnus should have in mind when using the alumni placement service.

Foreign Students Study Education

Ten international students are enrolled in vocational teacher education under a grant from the International Cooperation Administration.

According to Dr. S. Lewis Land, director of the program, six students from Taiwan are enrolled in industrial education and four students from the Taiwan Normal University are enrolled in home economics.

The students, who will study and travel in this country, will take formal course work and do field work in the area schools.

As leaders in their own countries the students are preparing to improve the education programs in their homelands with techniques studied at Penn State.

Following the football game, the customary traffic plan of only westbound traffic on College Ave. and eastbound traffic on Beaver Ave. will be followed. Only southbound traffic coming off campus on Burrowes St. will be permitted.
