

Players Schedule 'Borkman' Tryouts

Have you ever pictured yourself playing the role of a mature man who believes himself to be the "Napoleon of Business?" If you have, the Penn State Players are looking for you.

Tryouts for "John Gabriel Borkman," third Players' production of the year, will be held at 7 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday evenings in the Greenroom of Schwab Auditorium.

There are parts for five women and three men.

Persons who have previous acting experience and can appear middle-aged with a minimum amount of make-up are particularly needed for the three major roles, according to Warren Smith, director. The remaining roles do not require "mature" actors and everyone is welcome to try out, Smith added.

The three major roles are Borkman, his wife and his wife's twin sister. Action centers around a three-way volley for control over the life of Borkman's son, who is of college age.

Borkman lives a self-imposed life of exile in his home after serving a prison term for embezzlement of share holders' profits. While in exile he dreams of the day he will return to the business world he once controlled.

The play was written at the turn of the century by Henrik Ibsen. Ibsen ran away from home when he was 16 and took a job as pharmaceutical apprentice. While in his twenties he

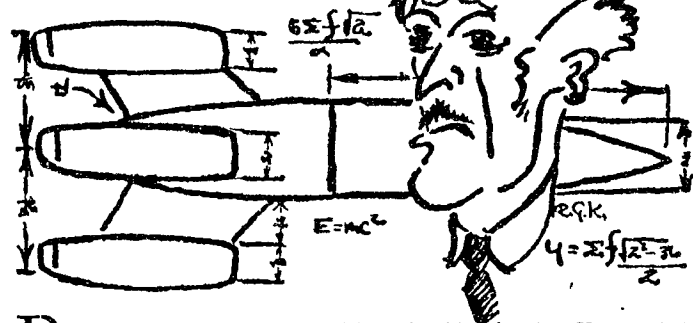

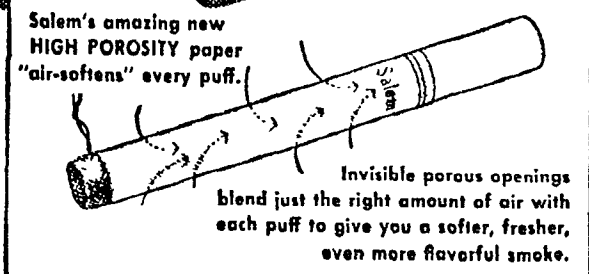
