

New Dorm Project Under Construction

A new dormitory project to house 1064 women is now underway.

Scene of the new construction program is the intersection of N. Corner Rd. and Curtain Rd. across from the University flower gardens.

The project, which began early in the summer, includes construction of three 8-story dormitories, a 5-story dormitory and a 2-story dining hall.

ICCB Committee To Plan Study Of Registration

The first step to express student opinion on the reorganization of the registration system was made by the Inter-College Council Board last night.

David Epstein, board chairman, appointed William Bowers, president of the Engineering and Architecture Student Council, chairman of a committee to study the present registration system and its problems.

Epstein said the committee would be expected to set up surveys and compile statistics in an attempt to determine such things as how many students were not able to schedule the courses they needed or wanted in past registrations.

The suggestion for this committee originated in the Engineering and Architecture Council and was presented by Bowers at last night's board meeting.

The board's action followed the statement made yesterday by Dr. Robert G. Bernreuter, special assistant to the President for student affairs, that students may be registering shortly under a new system.

Pearson to Remain as Chairman

Frank Pearson, chairman of University Party, yesterday reversed his decision to resign and decided to stay on as party chairman.

Pearson had told the University Party Executive Committee Sunday that he would resign from the chairmanship. He was to have announced his resignation at an open party meeting at 7 p.m. Sunday in 121 Sparks.

At the executive committee meeting he explained that he could not devote enough time to his studies if he remained party chairman.

Pearson said yesterday, however, that there are "too many other things to take into consideration."

The Executive Committee will meet at 4:30 p.m. Sunday to discuss whether they will oppose or support an Encampment recommendation that the president of the Student Government Association chair the Assembly.

Pearson said that the committee will definitely vote on the issue and will take a stand on it at the meeting.

A revised party constitution will also be discussed and voted on at both the executive committee and the open party meetings.

The dining hall will house the lounges and a post office in addition to the dining halls. It will be built large enough for two more 8-story residence halls that will possibly be built some time later. These two dorms would house 550 more students.

At present foundations are being prepared for the buildings. According to Walter Weigand, director of the physical plant, construction of the buildings is going well. Weigand said a warm winter will help construction of the buildings.

Poles for power lines to the area are also being set. As soon as these are set they will be strung and put to use by the building contractors.

A September 1961 deadline has been set for completion of the five buildings now under construction.
