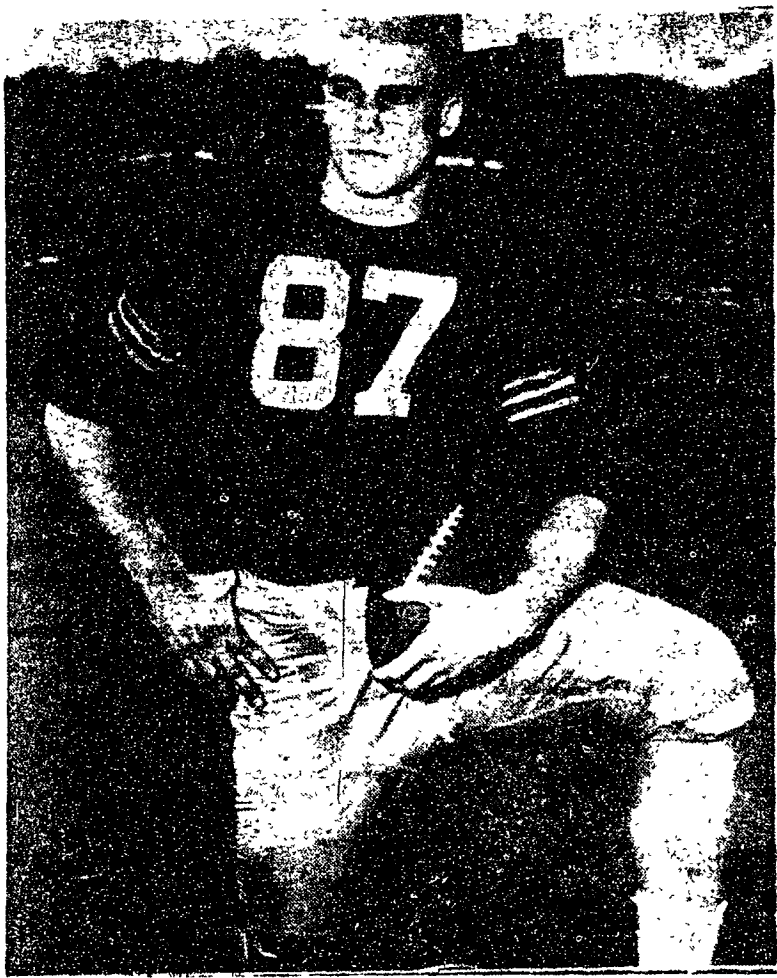


'Team Spirit Highest in Years,' Botula Says

The rest of the line finds Frank Korbini and Sam Stelatella at guards, Andy Stynchula and Stu Barber at tackles, and Jim Graham at center.
Galen Hall calls the signals for the second unit and his halfbacks are Dick Pae and Eddie Caye. Jack Urban, who started in Caye's place last week has an injured knee and may not be able to go at full speed today. Sam Sobczak is the fullback.
Army's probable starting lineup has Carpenter and Don Usry at ends, Mike Jezoir and Al Vanderbush at guards, and Bill Yost and Bob McCarthy at tackles.
Centering for Caldwell will be big Bob Oswaldel. Army coach Dale Hall has nominated Roger Zaliskas to take over Anderson's left halfback spot. Steve Waldrop is the right half. Don Bonko or John Eielson will be the fullback.
Today's game will be tenth in a series which dates back to 1899 when the Lions beat Army, 6-0. The Lions haven't won since then but hopes are high for a win today.
"In my three years on the varsity, I've never seen team spirit as high as it has been during the past week," said Botula, the Lion captain. "The players are really keyed up to fever pitch."
"Each player on this squad is determined to be twice as good as they've been in the games to date."
The Lions will be looking for their fourth straight win today.
The weather will be sunny and cool for this afternoon's game at West Point. Winds will be rather gusty from a westerly direction with velocities running about 15 miles an hour. Temperatures should be in the upper 50's at game time.
They've beaten Missouri, 19-8; V.M.I., 21-0; and Colgate, 58-20.
Army is after its second victory. The Cadets walloped Boston College, 44-8, in their opener, but lost to Illinois last week, 20-14.
The Lions' next game is the homecoming affair with Boston University at Beaver Field next Saturday. Following that, they will travel to Cleveland to take on Illinois.

TKE, Phi Kappa Sig Score IM Grid Wins

Phi Kappa Sigma and Tau Kappa Epsilon last year's champ and runnerup respectively opened their drives toward the "59" title in last evening's IM football action. Both teams registered wins, Phi Kappa Sigma defeating Delta Chi, 46-7, and TKE downing Lambda Chi Alpha, 20-7.

The Phi Kappa Sig-Delta Chi game was no contest from the very beginning as Larry DiGiacinto completed passes at his own convenience. DiGiacinto led PhiKSig to a 27-0 halftime lead, and ended up with six TD heaves for the final count of 46-7. On the receiving end of DiGiacinto's passes were: Jake Trueblood 2, Al Lammey 2, Mike Beattie, and Russ Stevenson.

TKE, losing 7-6 at the half, rallied behind the passing of Herb Ludwig to dominate the play in the second half. It was a varied attack that TKE featured with numerous men on the receiving end of Ludwig's passes. Gene Flick, Chuck Bibleheimer, and Tom Phillips each hauled in a TD pass.

In other fraternity action, Omega Psi Phi and Phi Delta Theta recorded victories. Omega Psi Phi won its game over Alpha Sigma Phi on the strength of a 40-yard pass play with trackster John Farriera on the receiving end. This was the game's only score as the men from Psi Phi hung on to win, 7-0.

Another track man, Bill Schwab, lead Phi Delta Theta

in its 13-0 decision over Tau Phi Delta. Schwab hit Don Book for 5 yards and 6-0 first half margin. It was Schwab to Book again in the second half, this time for 25 yards. Tau Phi Delta never threatened as the Phi Delt pass defense took charge.

In independent play, Erie and Watts I checked in with their second straight victories. Ex-basketballer Bob Edwards' Erie team scored early as Jim Connors hit George Ehringer for 30 yards and the only score of the game. Connors was the hero on defense also. He intercepted a last ditch Blair pass on his 5-yard-line to protect the 6-0 victory.

Bruce Campbell booted a 45-yard field goal with 1 second remaining to play to enable Delaware to whip Lehigh 3-0. Prior to Campbell's kick, Lehigh had dominated the play, leading on first downs 8-1. It was Delaware's first victory and Lehigh's second straight loss.

In the night's final game, Linden shut out Cedar, 16-0. The passing, running, and kicking of Mike Pennington led the Linden Hall men in their win. Pennington ran 35 yards for one score and passed 20 yards for the other. To make his night perfect, the "triple threat" kicked a 30-yard field goal. Linden's eight interceptions thwarted the Cedars.

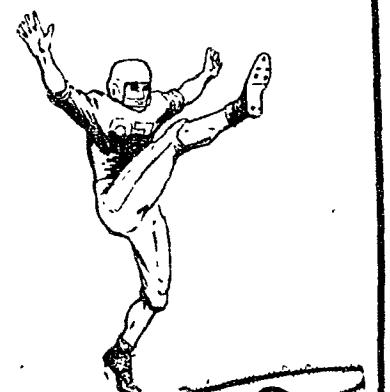
