Non-credit courses in religion sponsored by the University Christian Association began Monday and will continue for 10 weeks.

Registration will continue through the second meeting of each course in the respective classroom or in the UCA office in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel. The fee is \$1.00 per course or 50 cents for UCA members.

The five courses meeting at 4.15 p.m. in the Eisenhower Chapel are: "The Life and Teaching of Jesus the Christ," instructed by Miss Genevieve Dilts, associate director of the UCA, Mondays, 210; "Basic Christian Ethics," by Rev. Arthur Seyde, Lutheran Campus Pastor, Tuesdays, 104; "Basic Christian Beliefs," by Rev. Donald McIlvride, Presbyterian Campus Minister, Tuesdays, 210; "The Development of Christianity," by Samuel Gibson, executive director, UCA, Wednesdays, 210; and "The Old Testament, A Study of the Prophetic Writings," by Rev. Richard Nutt, Thursdays, 210.

These courses are offered by the UCA to supplement the regular academic program for students. They are open to all interested persons regardless of religious affiliation.

The girls will help Dean Dorothy J. Lipp, who is in charge of all residence hall women; Mrs. Norma Mountain, in charge of hat women and Panhellenic Council; Mrs. Lois McCulloch, in charge of Women's Student Government and Leonides and Mrs. R. Mae Shultz, in charge of freshman women.

Work began Oct. 5 and will continue throughout the year. Following the scheduling system set up by Joan Beidler, project coordinator, there will be at least one girl in the office every day.



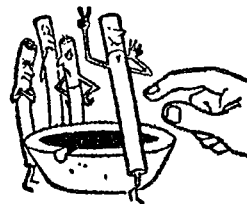
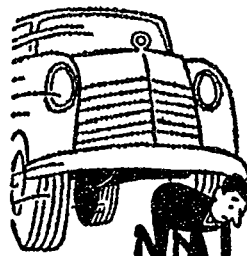
