

Lucas Gains AP Honors For Army Performance

Richie Lucas, Penn State's gifted quarterback, yesterday was named back of the week in the Associated Press' poll for his outstanding offensive and defensive play in leading the unbeaten Nittany Lions to their first victory over Army in 60 years.

The 21-year-old, 6-1 185-pound senior from Glassport, Pa., scored two touchdowns, twice intercepted important passes, one in the closing minutes of the game, and made several vital open field tackles.

In addition he passed for 97 yards and ran for 60 more in the 17-11 victory at West Point Saturday.

Lucas was previously honored as Sports Illustrated's Back of the Week and UPI's Quarterback of the Week for his performance in the Lions' 19-8 conquest of Missouri in the season's opener.

"A great game by a great player," was the comment of the Army coaching staff as well as the press box experts. They were unanimous in picking him as the outstanding back on the field.

With all his brilliance, Lucas was pressed for the honor by a horde of other backs across the nation.

Other standouts in major games included Georgia Tech's Tax Anderson; Purdue's Bernie Allen; Louisiana State's Billy Cannon; North Carolina's Jack Cummings; Ivan Tonic, Pittsburgh; Bob Eckhoff, Northwestern; Art Baker, Syracuse; Rene Ramirez and Jim Saxton, Texas; Prentice Gault, Oklahoma; Rich Mayo, Air Force Academy, and Mel Meyers of Illinois.

Maxie Baughan, captain and center of Georgia Tech, was chosen the AP's lineman of the week. Baughan and fullback Anderson were the outstanding players in Tech's 14-7 triumph over Tennessee.

Stynchula Moves Up To 1st Unit

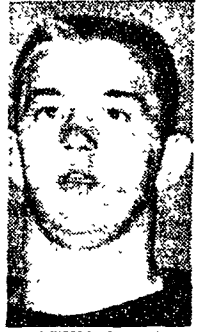
The 227-pound Stynchula replaces Charley Janerette. Stynchula was a starter a good part of last season, but this year he and Janerette have been splitting the work.

Speaking of Saturday's game, Engle says he expects Boston U. to give the Lions a good game. "I look for a good ball game because Boston University has a bunch of scrappers," Engle said. Last year the Lions walloped the Terriers, 34-0, before an Eastern television audience.

Trackman Bill Schwab hit Eldon Reed in the coffin corner from 16 yards out late in the second half to give Phi Delt a 7-0 victory over ZBT. A 40-yard pass from Schwab to Tom Hancock on the previous play set up the TD.

Joe Ferrer's extra point was the margin of victory in ATO's 7-6 win over Tau Phi Delta. A pass deflected into the hands of Joe Jockinson gave Tau Phi Delt a TD early in the game.

With one minute to go in the first half Kim Packard intercepted a pass to give ATO a scoring opportunity. Seconds later Jerry Rogers passed 20 yards to Lou Brown for the TD.

Two passes from Lunn Miller to Brownie Lane proved the difference in a hard-fought game as Alpha Zeta downed Delta Theta Sigma, 13-0.
