

Soccermen Out to Even Season's Record at 2-2

Ken Hosterman's booters will meet the Red Raiders of Colgate today at Hamilton, New York, in an attempt to even their season's record at two wins and two losses.

The Red Raiders will be going all out to upset the Nittanians in this the 15th game of the State-Colgate series. Coach Mark Randall's Raiders will be motivated by the fact that they have never defeated the Lions. State won its 17th straight over the Raiders last year in overtime, 2-1.

Coach Hosterman expects Colgate to be fired up and running in an attempt to end the 17-year jinx.

State will have to solve their biggest problem of the season, that of mounting a sound offense, if they expect to get by Colgate, not to mention their future opponents Maryland, Temple, Army and Navy, the powers of the East.

State has already had one long skein of victories come to an end this season. They were upended by Bucknell, 2-1, in the season opener after 22 straight over the Bisons from Lewisburg. The following Saturday, the Lions were thwarted for the third year in a row in their attempts to defeat West Chester as they bowed, 5-1.

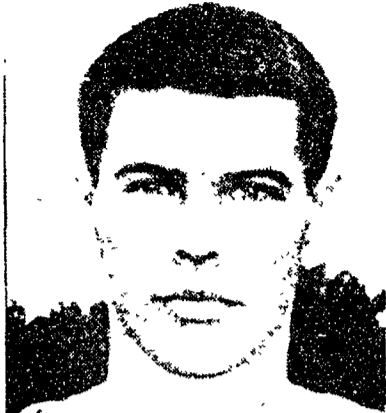
State then downed Syracuse, 6-0, with their first show of offense this season.

Except for certain parts of the West Chester game, the Lion defense has been very strong. Dave Grubbs and Larry Fegley have roamed the area around the goal like they own it.

Now that Fegley's charley horse has responded to treatment, the Lions will be even stronger around the goal. Grubbs will get the starting assignment with Fegley on ready reserve. The rest of

the defense is set with Al Nieto and Wayne Rodgers at the fullback slot, and Bill Rieron, Gene Raiford, and Phil Gum holding down the halfback positions.

Hosterman will go along with the same forward line that performed against Syracuse. Captain Pete Wadsworth and Jim Hockenbrock will be on the right side, Gary Miller and Lou Van Rafelghem on the left side and sophomore Howie Farrer, a four goal performer last week, will start at the center-forward position.

CORNER KICKS — The Lions' next opponent, Maryland, has scored 28 goals in four games. The injury jinx still plagues the Nittanians. This week Loren Kliese will not make the trip to Hamil-

ton due to a charley horse. Wayne Rodgers and sophomore fullback, Ed Naujocks both played for Olney High in Philly. Bill Fiedler, last year's leading scorer sidelined for the season, will return to State next year.
