Four Freshmen to Run In WSGA Final Elections

Four women will run for Freshman Senator seats in the Women's Student Government Association tomorrow.

Those running are Sue Henderson, a home economics major from Springfield, Va.; Mareia Michalski, a home economics major from Erie; Betty Skade, an elementary education major from Maplewood, N.J.; and Paula White, an elementary education major from Clariton.

The four were chosen in primary elections yesterday. The two receiving the highest votes tomorrow will become freshman senators.

Marilyn Barndt, WSGA elections chairman, said that the four candidates won by a large majority.

About 50 per cent of the freshman women voted in the elections. This was a good turnout for primaries, Miss Barndt said.

The final elections will be

from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. tomorrow. All freshman women may vote in the final elections. They must present their matriculation cards in order to cast a ballot.

Voting in Redifer Dining Hall will be for freshmen living in South Halls. Freshmen in Thompson, McKee and Irvin may vote in Thompson lounge. Voting in Grange lounge will be for women living in Grange, town women, and all other freshman women on campus with no designated polling place.

Work Advances 700 Violators At Skating Rink Receive Tickets

Steelwork for the mammoth canopy being erected over the University skating rink is nearing completion and the contracting company of G. M. McCrossin is making preparations for applying the roof.

Between the nine steel arches which will support the roof, steel stringers are being run. The wooden roof will be bolted to these stringers.

When the roofing is in place, it will be covered with built-up roofing material consisting of layers of felt and tar.

Work of placing the roofing lumber is expected to begin next week.

Three students received suspended sentences but were held for \$1 court costs at Traffic Court Monday night. A fourth student was fined \$1 for parking in the wrong area.

More than 700 students who received tickets have appeared before traffic violations officer, Captain Phillip A. Marks, since the start of the fall semester.

"Many (students) receive tickets because they are ignorant of the rules," said Marks.

Members of the Traffic Court and Marks believe that the number of violators would decrease if students would read carefully the parking and traffic regulations and keep up with new revisions as published in The Collegian.

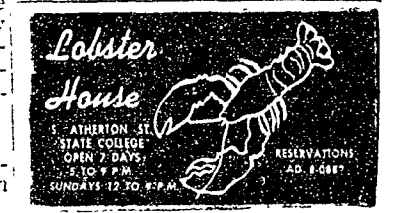
Atherton Receives New Head Hostess

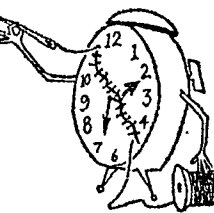
