Norm Neff and Henry Opperman hold down the wing positions, Tom Mulraney and Andy Stynchula are the tackles. Bud Kohlhaas and Popp are the guards and Jay Huffman is the starting center.

There are two changes on the second unit. Senior John Sava moves into Popp's guard spot and Roger Kochman will replace the injured Dick Pae at left half.

Galen Hall will quarterback the "readies" and he has Kochman, Eddie Caye, and Sam Sobczak in the backfield.

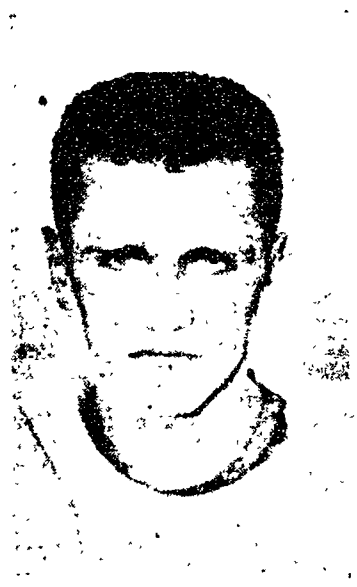
On the line the Lions have John Bozick and Bob Mitinger at end, Sava and kicking specialist Sam Stelatella at guard, and Charley Janerette and Stew Barber are the tackles. Bill Saul is the center.

Changes on the third unit find converted tackle Bob Gilmour in a guard spot and Tony Wayne at a halfback position.

Pappy Lewis also will start a veteran team this afternoon. Co-Captain Ben McComb will be the left end. Carl Dannenberg (220-pounds) is the left

tackle. West Virginia's other co-captain Bill Lopasky is the left guard.

Joe Wirth will be the center. On the right side of the line Lewis has Pete Tolly at guard, Glen Bowman at tackle and Dave Hess at end.

Joining Williams in the backfield are speedster Ray Peterson at left half, John Marra at right half and Bob Benke at fullback. All are lettermen except Hess.

Next week Penn State hosts Syracuse and West Virginia travels to Southern California.

Penn State's 1959 soccer team will be trying to accomplish two objectives this afternoon when they clash with the Midshipmen from Annapolis at 1:30 on Beaver Field.

Kenny Hosterman's booters will be trying to keep alive their chances for a winning season and at the same time

trying to avenge last year's 3-2 loss to the 'future protectors of our seas.'

The Lions are now 1-4 for the year and therefore must win all remaining games if they hope to end up with a winning record. The Nittanies have had winning seasons for the last 16 years.

Last year at Annapolis the Lions went down to defeat, 3-2. This game seemed to be the one that broke the Nittanies' back, as they could not seem to play winning ball thereafter. In past years, the Navy-Penn State game usually had a lot to do with deciding the Eastern, if not the National championship. However, this year both teams are playing sub-par ball and as a result this game has little nation-wide importance. But you can bet that both the Middies and the Staters will be playing as if a "title" depended on the outcome, since past Navy-State games have been hoily contested.

Both teams are pretty evenly matched as the defenses of both are on the weak side. Navy has to rate a slight edge in the offensive department on their performance against the Bisons of Bucknell. Navy downed the Bi-

sons, 5-0, while the Nittanies lost to the same team, 2-1.

Navy has had more goals scored on them this year than all of last season. The Lions have allowed 15 goals for an average of 3 per game.

The Lions lead in the series with Navy 20-8, but the State booters have only been able to win in one out of the last four years against the Middies.

Carrying the scoring lead for the Middies will be center-forward Dick Stengel and wing Carman Tortora. Stengel netted two goals against the Lions last year and Tortora came into his own Wednesday with three goals against Bucknell.

The Lions will depend on captain Pete Wadsworth and Gary Miller to carry their load in the department.

'Ole' Miss Challenges LSU In Top Grid Battle Today

The biggest game of the year—top-ranked and unbeaten Louisiana State against third-ranked and unbeaten Mississippi—has the national stage all to itself tonight for a game that could easily carry a "made in Hollywood" tag.

Before these two giants get together the Jay's other major games will have been finished but none will carry the impact of the much-talked about meeting of the two Southeastern Conference favorites.

LSU, rated No. 1 in the latest Associated Press poll, is going for broke with its three-platoon white, go and Chinese Bandits against a Mississippi team that is rated third nationally in total offense and defense.

LSU, second nationally in total defense has not allowed a touchdown in running up a 6-0 record and 18 straight victories. It has given a field goal apiece to Rice and Miami. Mississippi (6-0) has only allowed Tulane to cross its goal line.

Second-ranked Northwestern (6-0) plays Big Ten rival Indiana (3-2). The Wildcats, leading the Big Ten, will have halfbacks Ron Burton and Ray Purdin off the injury list.

In the East, Syracuse (5-0), ranked fifth, and leading the nation in total defense and offense, plays unpredictable Pitt (3-3) while Penn State (6-0) and seventh-ranked, meets West Virginia (3-3).

The other games involving up-ranked teams find Texas (No. 4) putting its 6-0 record on the line against Southern Methodist (3-1-1). Big Five titan Southern California (No. 6) meets old rival California (1-5).

Grid Undefeated Streak

The longest undefeated grid streak for the Nittany Lions lasted from Oct. 25, 1919, to Oct. 28, 1922. During this time, Penn State won 30 straight contests.

Cagers Started in 1897

Basketball originated at Penn State in 1897. In that year, the Lions split a home-and-home series with the Bisons of Bucknell.

The Nittany Lion gridders, since 1899, have had seven contests with the Yale Bulldogs. Penn State stands 0-7-0 in the series.
