Construction of the extension to the Home Economics South Building is progressing on schedule, according to Euan Miller, construction superintendent of the \$1.5 million project.

Ruling Change; Curry Eligible For Candidacy

The decision ruling Donald Curry, junior in industrial engineering from Reading, ineligible to run as a Campus Party candidate for a position on Student Government Association Assembly was reversed yesterday by the Elections Committee.

The reversal was upheld by SGA President Leonard Julius, said Robert Umstead, acting co-chairman of the committee.

Curry was first ruled ineligible to run by former Elections Committee Chairman Stanley Foster because Curry had originally registered for University Party and then switched to Campus Party to accept the nomination. This decision was upheld by the new Elections Committee co-chairmen, Umstead and Sharon Hoffman.

The decision was then reversed after being reviewed by Elections Committee chairmen because "no definite procedure for changing of party affiliation had been publicized, other than in party meetings," and because "Curry was unaware of the procedure."

Munroe's Name Omitted From Nominees' List

Janet Munroe was nominated Sunday by University Party for sophomore class representative on the Student Government Association Assembly.

Miss Munroe's name was inadvertently omitted from a list of nominees in yesterday's Daily Collegian.

Two Offices Locate In McAllister

McAllister Hall, formerly a women's residence hall, will be used as an office building this year.

The Department of Correspondence Instruction and the Department of Education Counseling have already moved into McAllister. The Department of Public Safety is in the process of moving.

These department were previously located in Pollock Circle. According to Stanley H. Campbell, director of special projects for business administration, the re-location of these departments may not be permanent.

Since the abandoning of McAllister as a residence hall in the beginning of the semester, requests have been made by various departments for office space in the building, he said.

A committee has been considering the requests and will decide which other departments, if any, will be moved into the building, he said.

Campbell said that no remodeling has been done to the building. The office equipment is being moved into the same rooms which residents used to use.

McAllister was built in 1904 and used as a men's residence hall.

In 1915 it was remodeled to serve as a women's residence hall.

Miller, superintendent for Earl L. Cump Inc. of Chambersburg, the construction firm, said that the outside work of laying sidewalks, parking lots and curbs will probably be completed before freezing weather arrives.

The interior of the building has been painted and ceilings are presently being put into the rooms of the office wing, which connects the new structure with the main building.

Some speculation has been caused by passers-by who notice the pastel-colored offices. Miller said that the Department of Home Economics chose the color scheme, and he didn't know whether the reason was psychological or just decorative.

The three stories of the north wing will be used as laboratories for textiles, sewing and cooking. Additional rooms, such as the faculty and graduate student design laboratory, will also be included in the new building.

Coeds who drive on campus as a result of a new regulation this year, will be pleased to learn that two parking lots, each 120 by 150 feet, are being paved as part of the many construction projects.

An average of 60 men work daily on the project and are presently directing their efforts to complete the outside work by winter.

Miller said the University contract calls for completion of the project for April. "I know we can finish in time easily, if we beat the weather," he said.

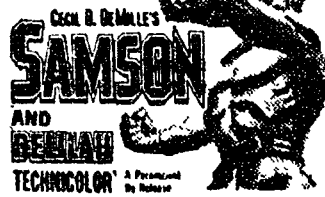
