

# MI Courses To Decide On 'Honesty'

Elections for the adoption of an academic honor system will be held in the curriculums of fuel technology, mining, and mineral preparations engineering before the next meeting of the Mineral Industries council is held.

It is felt by the professors that such requests indicating interest in the new system would further insure its success, council members agreed.

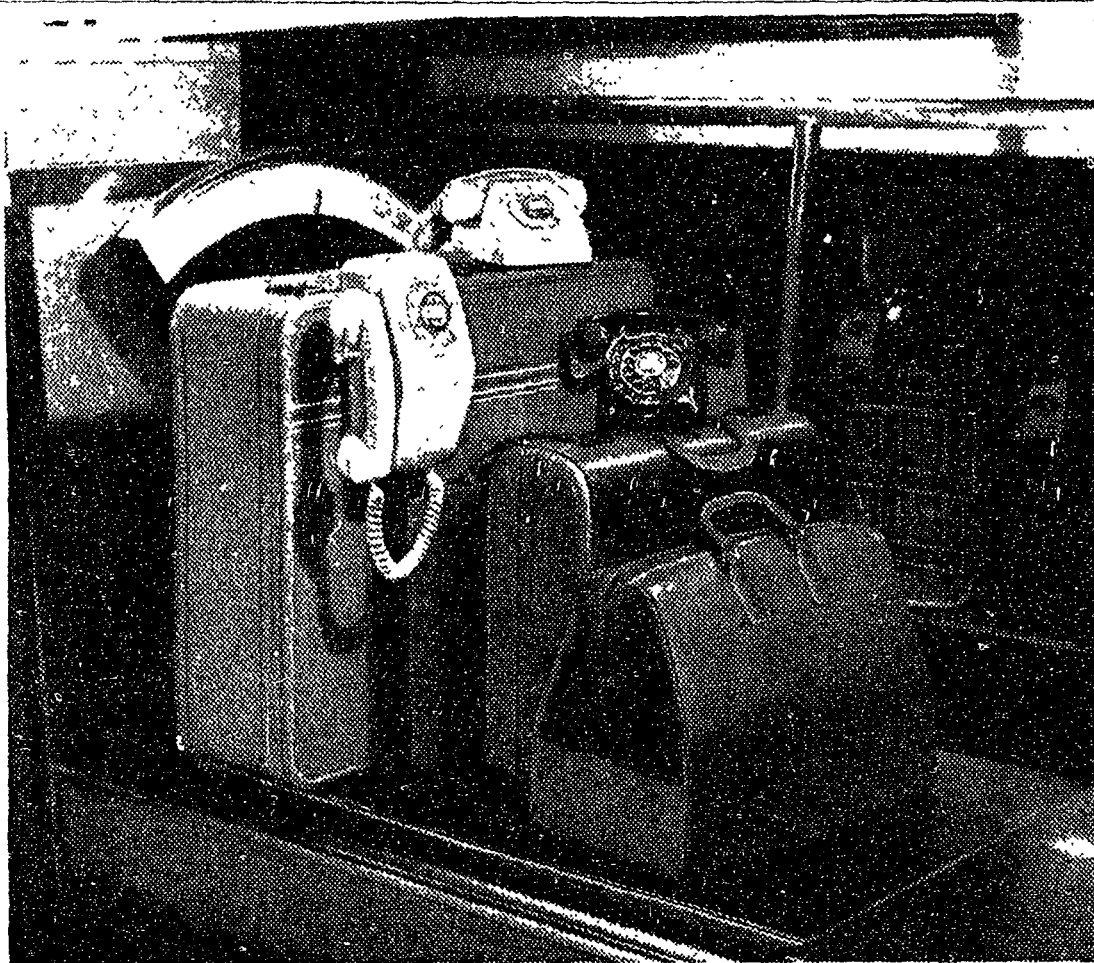
