

# 4 on Faculty To Fill Offices In State College

Four of the 10 members of the University faculty who appeared on the ballot came out victorious in the unofficial results of Tuesday's election.

Arnold Addison (R), personnel director and associate professor of engineering in the Ordinance Research Laboratory, and Lyne S. S. Hoffman (D), associate professor of English composition, were elected to the State College Borough Council.

A. Witt Hutchinson (D), professor and associate head of the Department of Chemistry, was elected to the School Board.

G. A. (Grover) Speardy (D) defeated his Republican opponent for the office of treasurer.

The Democrats made a powerful showing in the Republican stronghold of Centre County by picking up six of the 13 county offices at stake.

The turnout was close to the expected figure, approximately 18,600 voting out of 27,173 registered, or 67 per cent.

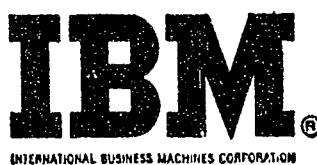
