WSGA Alters One Day Rule For Traveling

Women students must inform their hostess if they wish to leave campus and return on the same day on a 1 a.m. traveling permission, the Women's Student Government Association Senate has ruled.

Formerly women were required to receive permission from the WSGA Judicial Board Chairman. In other business it was decided that the Senate executive committee will consider changes in women's rules before they are presented to the whole body. Preliminary discussions on rules have been taking too much time at the meeting, Jessie Janjigian, WSGA president, said.

say objectively whether or not the program is a success or failure," Wilmer Wise, assistant to the dean of men for fraternity affairs, said.

According to Wise, the members of the IFC who drew up the plan did not give as much consideration to the mechanisms of measuring the success or failure of the program as they might have.

Gary Gentzler, IFC president, said that many people have not taken into consideration the viewpoint of the rushees who have been directly affected by the plan. "I think that by considering the rushees as well as fraternity viewpoints on deferred rushing we will be able to cover areas which the program does not cover now," he said.

Gilbert Sergeant, IFC secretary-treasurer, agrees that a more liberal open house policy, should be put into the plan. Sergeant said that this could be done without changing the basic system.

The fraternity exchange arrangement with the University's Department of Housing is another area of rushing which might be improved, Ronald Resh, IFC vice president, said.

Under the present plan, men with housing contracts who pledge a fraternity at the beginning of the school year and decide to live in the fraternity house, must find an acceptable replacement to take their place in the dormitory by Dec. 25.

Resh said that if upperclassmen could be released from their housing contracts when they pledge, the rushing system would undoubtedly be strengthened.

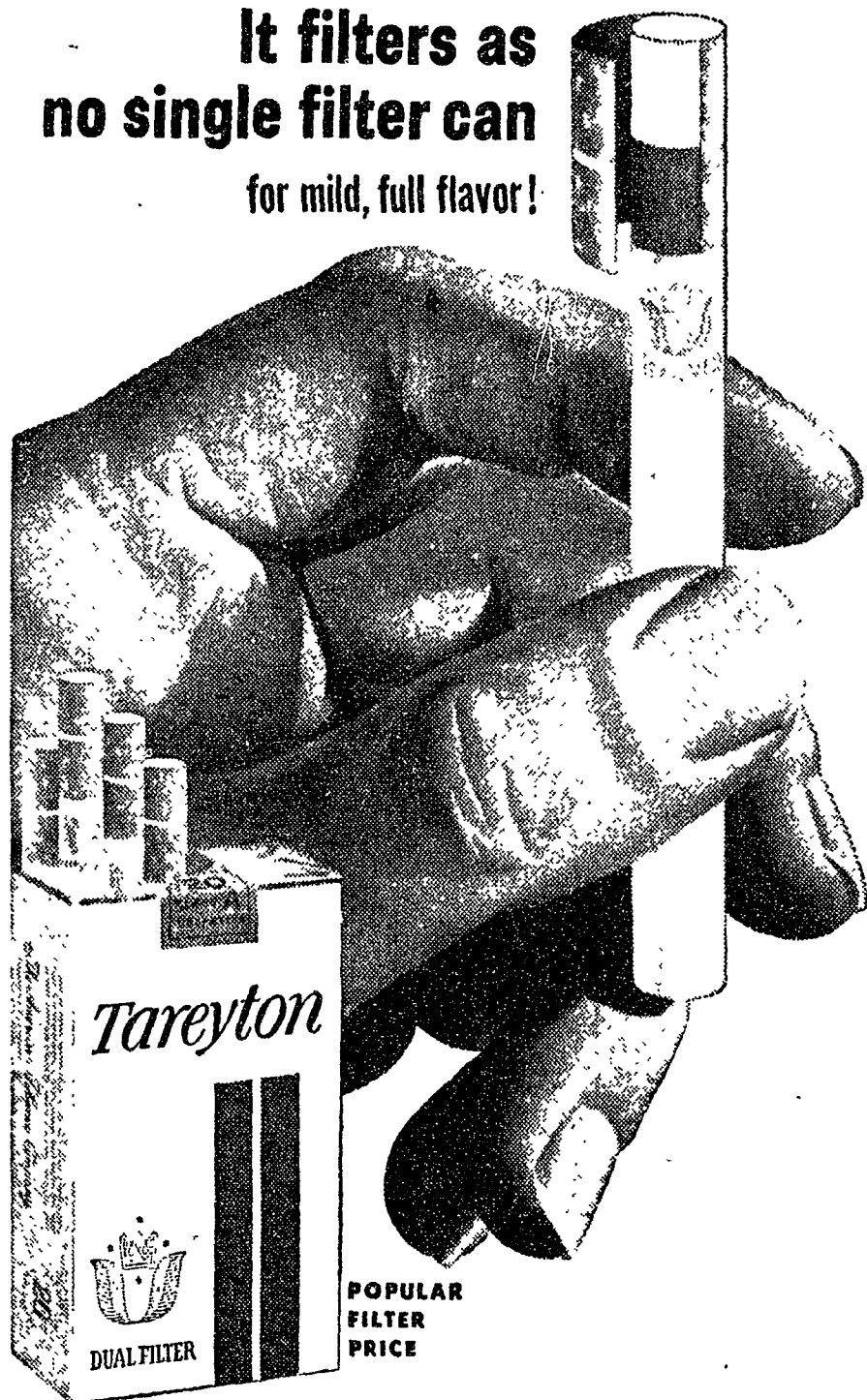
