

# University to Participate In Institute

The University will participate in the 1960-61 Academic Year Institute sponsored by the National Science Foundation to improve teaching standards.

The foundation has tentatively approved grants totaling \$9.2 million for the program. The University and the University of Pennsylvania are the two institutions participating in the program from this state.

The purpose of the nation-wide program is to help science and mathematics teachers improve their subject matter knowledge through full-time advance study during one year. It seeks to improve the quality of instruction by bringing up to date material presented to the students.

The University's program, under the direction of William H. Powers, will emphasize work in biology, chemistry, earth sciences, mathematics and physics.

The Foundation grants will provide \$3000 for each teacher participating with additional allowances for dependents, books and travel.

The program, which was begun five years ago, has helped about 3400 science and mathematics teachers. About 1600 will be enrolled in this year's program.

The University has been participating in this program since 1957.

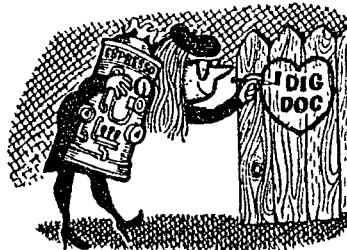

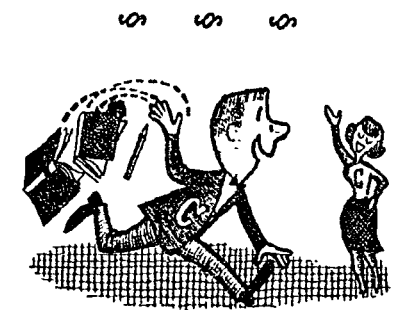
