

DU Gridders Upset Defending IM Champ

Delta Upsilon, sparked by the offensive performances of Jack Melchior and Jim Anderson, pulled the biggest IM grid upset of the year when they beat defending champion Phi Kappa Sigma, 14-7, in the first round of the 1959 playoffs.

DU's first score of the evening came on a 70-yard pass play from Melchior to Anderson. The DU receiver was off and running and scampered 60 yards for the touchdown. Dave Hlay converted to make the score 7-0.

Later in the game, Melchior hit baseballer Larry Beighey with a 25-yard heave. Beighey legged it

yard field goal to give Nittany 29 a 3-0 win over the Studs. Nittany 29 was in a fourth down situation with the ball at a bad angle when McCombe kicked the field goal.

The game featured tight defensive play with interceptions being the keynote.

Sigma Nu, on a 60-yard toss from Fred Wolff to Jim Massie, downed previously unbeaten Chi Phi, 6-0. Wolff, with Sigma Nu leading on first downs, 4-3, stepped back and caught Massie in the clear to notch the only mark of the game.

A penalty cost Tau Kappa Epsilon the victory as they dropped a closely fought game to Phi Mu Delta, in an overtime contest.

In other grid games, NROTC Alpha defeated Nittany 23, 6-0; and Westmoreland took Nittany 22, 6-0.

Tomorrow night, playoff action continues with two fraternity and four independent contests on tap.
