

6 Teams Move Up In IM Grid Playoffs

Two fraternities and four independent teams won second round playoff games in IM football last night to remain in contention for their respective league championships.

Rick Blend booted a tremendous 48-yard field goal for Phi Mu Delta's first score in a 13-3 victory over Alpha Sigma Phi.

Alpha Sig's Bill Walton knotted the score at 3-3 with a 16-yard kick near the end of the first half, but Phi Mu Delta was not to be denied.

Early in the second half Rick's twin brother Ron Blend hit pass catching artist Bob Luff in the end zone from 16 yards out and shortly after Rick added an 18-yard three-pointer to wrap up the scoring.

Trackman Bill Schwab hit Gil Burkhardt with scoring heaves of 16 and 30 yards to lead Phi Delta Theta to a 13-0 win over Sigma Nu.

Westmoreland kept its perfect record intact by sinking the Navy ROTC, 13-0. Ed Roberts passed 40 yards to Rick Urian for one score and 22 yards to Joe Beyers for another.

Baseball star Tom Durbin's passing was the difference as Burke A.C. edged Nittany 29 on first downs, 4-0.

Allegheny white-washed Linden, 7-0, when Ron Fedora intercepted a Mike Pennington pass and waltzed one yard into the end zone. The TD was set up on the previous play when Tom Phillips' 56-yard punt rolled dead on Linden's 1-yard line.

Delaware's "punchless wonders" scored their first touchdown of the season to down Nittany 25, 7-0. The score came when Bill Allen pitched out to Henry Caruncho who tossed 40 yards to Karl Fink in the end zone.

Delaware had not scored a touchdown in winning four previous games. Their defense has yet to be scored on.

Captain Dick Engelbrink will lead the harriers in quest of the coveted trophy. Engelbrink is an experienced performer in the IC4A. Last year he finished seventh to lead the Wernermen to fifth place in the championships.

This year, in the five dual meets, Engelbrink has carded two firsts, two thirds and a fourth.

Herm Weber and Steve Moorhead will run second and third respectively, for the Lions. Each has placed well this year. Weber in his last outing racked up a first for the Nittanians.
