

with numerous orchestras. In 1936 he went to Palestine where he reorganized the Palestine Symphony.

It was here that Arturo Toscannini, also a prominent conductor, first met Steinberg. He was so impressed with his musical ability that he invited Steinberg to the United States to direct the NBC Symphony.

After appearing with several orchestras all over the country, Steinberg signed a contract with the Pittsburgh Symphony in -1952.

The orchestra has had a long history, dating from 1896, when it was conducted by Victor Herbert, famous American composer.

The Pittsburgh Symphony has appeared in several cities in the country and has been called one of the greatest orchestras of the United States. The orchestra also gives two series of concerts annually for children.
