

WRA Will Invite Men To Play in Tournament

The Women's Recreation Association will innovate a coed volleyball tournament this spring which will be open to all women's living units and the men they invite to join their teams.

The executive board of the WRA announced that the event will be held at 7 to 9 p.m., Monday through Wednesday nights of the last week in April and the first two weeks in May.

Thirty-six teams will be able to participate in the tournament, each composed of four men and four women. A new combination of men's and women's rules is being composed by a joint committee of representatives from WRA and the men's intramural program. Playoffs will be held at the

conclusion of the tournament. The possibility of a trophy for the winning team is also being investigated by the committee. Students may sign up for the event through their intramural representatives.

"The event will not be included in the official intramural competition and probably not in the men's competition. Such a program has been held very successfully at other schools and WRA has decided that they would like to try their hand at it," according to Jean Nigh, WRA president.

In other business the board discussed final plans for the Christmas party which the association is sponsoring for the first and second grades of Matternville School, on the outskirts of State College. The party will include games, presents and refreshments for the children according to Priscilla Wasilko, chairman.

The board also announced that the deadline for entry preliminary lists for the bowling and basketball intramurals are due at noon Friday in 103 White.

which students need better preparation.

The last few years' research results have shown that there is a definite need for remedial work in the English and mathematics skill areas.

In 1958 a study was conducted to check the benefits of various kinds of review. Students who had a deficiency in mathematics and who wished to enter a field requiring math were given an option of reviewing. Some took a formal review here or at another school during the summer. Others received a guide from the University outlining review areas and reviewed independently.

The results showed that some benefit was obtained by any type of review, but that those who reviewed formally received better grades in analytical geometry.

Of those who reviewed informally, 45.5 per cent withdrew or received a grade of "F". There were no "A" grades and only 12.1 per cent received "B's".

Those who took the formal review did better in the course. Twenty-five per cent withdrew or failed, while 28.5 per cent received a grade of "B" or better.
