The last few years' research results have shown that there is a definite need for remedial work in the English and mathematics skill areas

In 1958 a study was conducted to check the benefits of various kinds of review. Students who had a deficiency in mathematics and who wished to enter a field requiring math were given an op-tion of reviewing. Some took a formal review here or at another school during the summer. Others received a guide from the University outlining review areas and reviewed independently.

The results showed that some benefit was obtained by any type of review, but that those who reviewed formally received better grades in analytical ge-

Of those who reviewed informally, 45 5 per cent withdrew or received a grade of "F". There were no "A" grades and only 12.1 per cent received "B's".

Those who took the formal re-

Those who took the formal review did beter in the course. Twenty-five per cent withdrew or failed, while 28.5 per cent received a grade of 'B" or better.
