

BusAd to Offer Open TV Course

Next semester, students will be able to earn University credits by watching television in their fraternity house or anywhere there is a TV set tuned to Channel 10.

A course in Personal Finance, officially listed as Commerce 8, will be taught over open-circuit television at 9 a.m. Monday, Wednesday, and Friday next semester. The course will be offered as an elective, but students in the College of Business Administration will not be allowed to schedule it.

To receive credit for the course, students must schedule it at registration and must pass two evening examinations and the final, according to David H. McKimley, associate dean of the College of Business Administration.

Arthur L. Williams, instructor in insurance, will be in charge of the telecast course. Eleven faculty members will participate in the instructions.

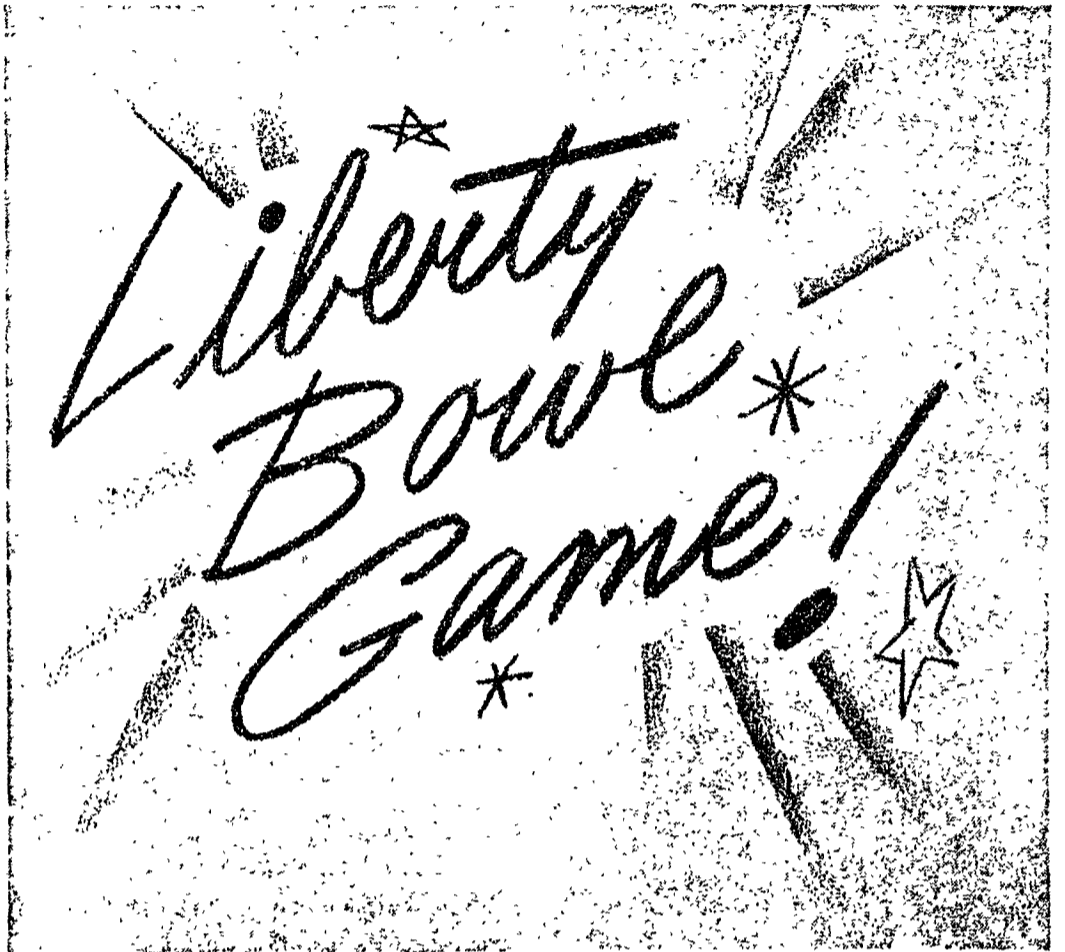
