What will the weather be Saturday in Philadelphia? This is a question that has gone through every student's mind as he or she looks forward to the Liberty Bowl game.

Many students have put off buying tickets because they want to wait and see what the weather is on the day of the game. If past records are any indication of what may be expected, there are numerous possibilities.

The middle of December is well known in the state's largest city for its varied weather. On occasions temperatures have changed as much as 20 degrees in a single hour. The thermometer has touched the 75-degree mark on several December days. But, on the other hand, it has been as low as 5 degrees below zero.

Howling snowstorms have paralyzed the city with 10-foot drifts. Yet, on other days, bright sunshine and mild southerly breezes have brought premature thoughts of spring.

The largest snowstorm ever observed in Philadelphia fell on a

December day in 1909. It was 21 inches deep. Many other six-inch or greater snows have hit the city in recent Decembers. Just two years ago the city was buried under a foot of snow in a near-blizzard early in the month.

Other unusual weather phenomena have also put in an appearance. Out-of-season thundersorms have drenched the city. Intense coastal storms have brought gale force winds and heavy precipitation.

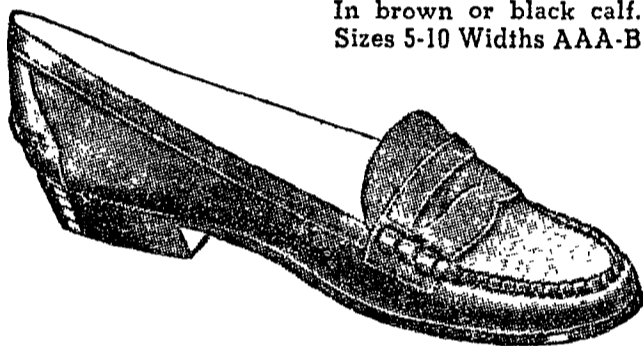
