

Nittany Christmas Party Called 'Great Success' by All Attending Little Theatre Cast To Give Parody

Nittany Area's first Christmas party for orphans was called a "great success" by all participating students, faculty members and orphans.

The orphans arrived at 12:15 p.m. Sunday in front of the Nittany Union Building ready to begin their big adventure. They were immediately taken inside and given a traditional turkey dinner with all the trimmings.

After dinner, two orphans were taken to each individual unit to be entertained by the residents. Coeds from Leonides had also offered to help entertain the orphans, and one went to each unit. The students entertained with Christmas skits and group singing.

The guests were then brought back to a gayly decorated Nittany Union Building where they saw movies for an hour. Three cartoons and a Christmas story were presented.

Since the youngsters were getting hungry again, five big cakes

and other refreshments were served to them.

A talent show was then put on with acts featuring a magician, act and puppet show. Mary Dugan, Indie Queen, also sang.

Gifts were distributed to each orphan by a robust Santa Claus, played by William Schimpf, last year's Nittany Council president.

Many University officials attended the affair including Dr. Robert G. Bernreuter, special assistant to the president, Frank J. Simes, dean of men, and Dorothy A. Lipp, dean of women. 




