# Kent Grad Fellowships Available

Students may now apply for the 1960-61 Kent Fellowships for graduate study which will lead to professional work in higher education.

The fellowships are given upon election to the Society of Fellows of the National Council on Religion in Higher Education.

The selection of new fellows is determined by intellectual ability and scholarly promise; a personal religious conviction; interest in a relation between religion and higher education; concern for the relevance of religion and education to the problems of modern life; and open-mindedness and an ability to work with people.

The stipend given to a Fellow depends upon individual circumstances but usually ranges per academic year up to \$1800 for married students and \$1200 for single students.

Applicants may be from any field of study in the arts and sciences in which the Doctor of Philosophy degree or its equivalent is given. Preference is given to persons under 30 years of age.

Interested students must submit an application by Jan. 23 to the office of the National Council. Further information may be obtained at the Graduate School Office in Willard.

Mordecai Treblow, graduate student in chemistry from Philadelphia, said, "This is the first time, to the best of my knowledge, that a college chess team in the United States has achieved varsity status." Treblow is also a director of the U.S. Chess Federation.

Dr. Orrin Frink, professor of mathematics, will coach the team, while William F. Fuller, manager of Associated Student Activities, will serve as manager.

Chess Club members William Bickham, senior in engineering-science from Philadelphia; Anthony Cantrone, junior in aeronautical engineering from Philadelphia; Gerald Eckman, senior in physics from Millersville; Frederick Shaffer, senior in physics from Somerset; and Richard Somerville, sophomore in meteorology from Alexandria, W.Va., have participated in a majority of this semester's matches.

Eugene Grumer, junior in fuel technology from Pittsburgh and Harry Mathews, junior in electrical engineering from Ligonier, will act as team alternates.

As an official University team they will receive traveling funds for team matches and tournaments. In the past traveling expenses were paid by the team members themselves.

The team is undefeated this season. They hold wins over Georgetown University, West Point, City College of New York, Columbia University, Carnegie Institute of Technology, the Marshall Chess Club and the "A" and "B" teams at the University of Pittsburgh, the present state champion.

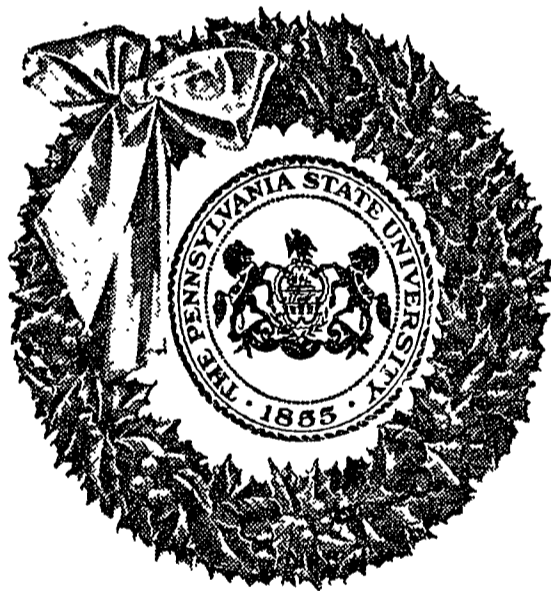
