(Continued from page one) and Julius said that Assemblymen over vacation might forget the arguments brought out in the issues if they were discussed now and brought up again later.

Hawley said it was felt that the issues the Rules Committee was considering Tuesday for inclusion on the agenda could be acted on more effectively after vacation. He, too, mentioned the Nittany question as one of these issues.

Byers, however, said he felt the issues "deserve attention at this time" and that it would be "deterimental" to let them wait.

John Brandt, alternate Assemblyman, also circulated a similar petition. Byers said that his and Brandt's lists a majority of the Assemblymen had expressed a desire to have a meeting tonight.

Byers said that there were no feelings that the executive body had deliberately not scheduled a meeting to stifle legislation. "Our main reason was to find

out if the majority wanted a meeting, and, if so, to take action on it if possible," he said. He said he was not sure what action he will take but that he would find out this morning.

(Continued from page one) dent involving a University construction worker this semester. A worker on the Pollock Circle Residence Hall project was killed when he fell seven stories on Oct. 30.

William Baughman, 22, of Fleming, was killed when a wooden frame, on which he was working, collapsed atop Building Four.

This summer a worker was blown 15 feet into the air by a dynamite blast but was uninjured. Another worker fell 25 feet from the Hammond Engineering project in September but was only slightly injured.

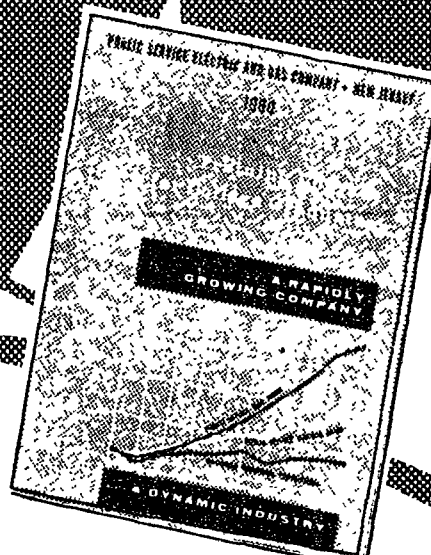
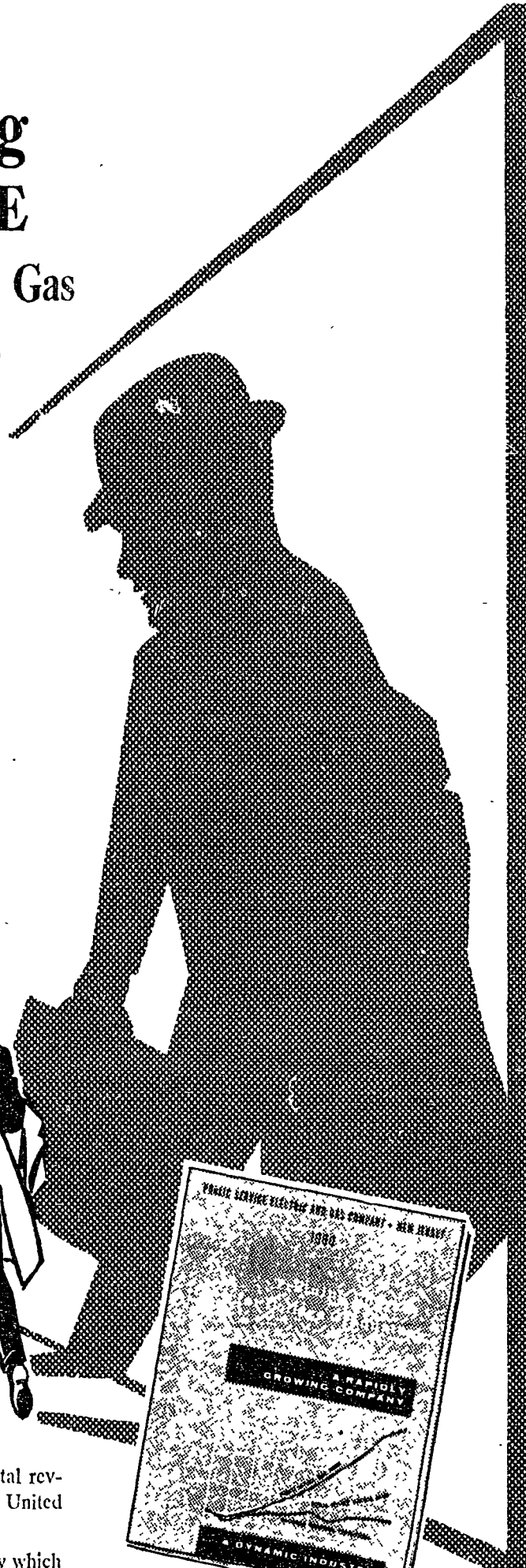
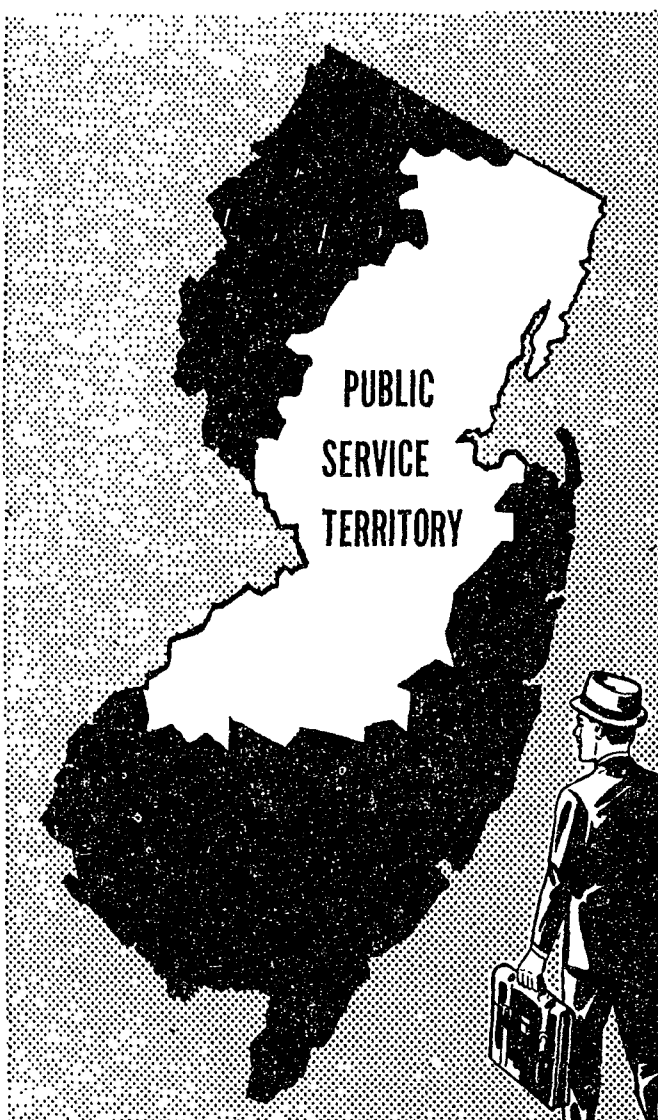
