

Unlimited Cuts To Be Handled By Assembly

The plan for unlimited cuts for students having at least a 3.5 average will be handled by the SGA Assembly rather than the Chemistry-Physics Student Council, where it originated, according to Irving Klein, council president.

Klein told the council, in its final meeting of the semester last night, that the plan would be carried out on a University-wide basis because it affected all the students rather than just those in the College of Chemistry and Physics.

He said that many high ranking University officials favor unlimited cuts. Some of them think that a certain average should be required, while others believe that all students should enjoy the privilege.

A complete set of bluebook files which includes finals has been made available to all students in the college by the council. Twenty-eight bound volumes of bluebooks are located in the Chemistry-Physics library.

Klein will be graduated in January and vice president Walt Eisman will assume the presidential duties until a new president is elected.

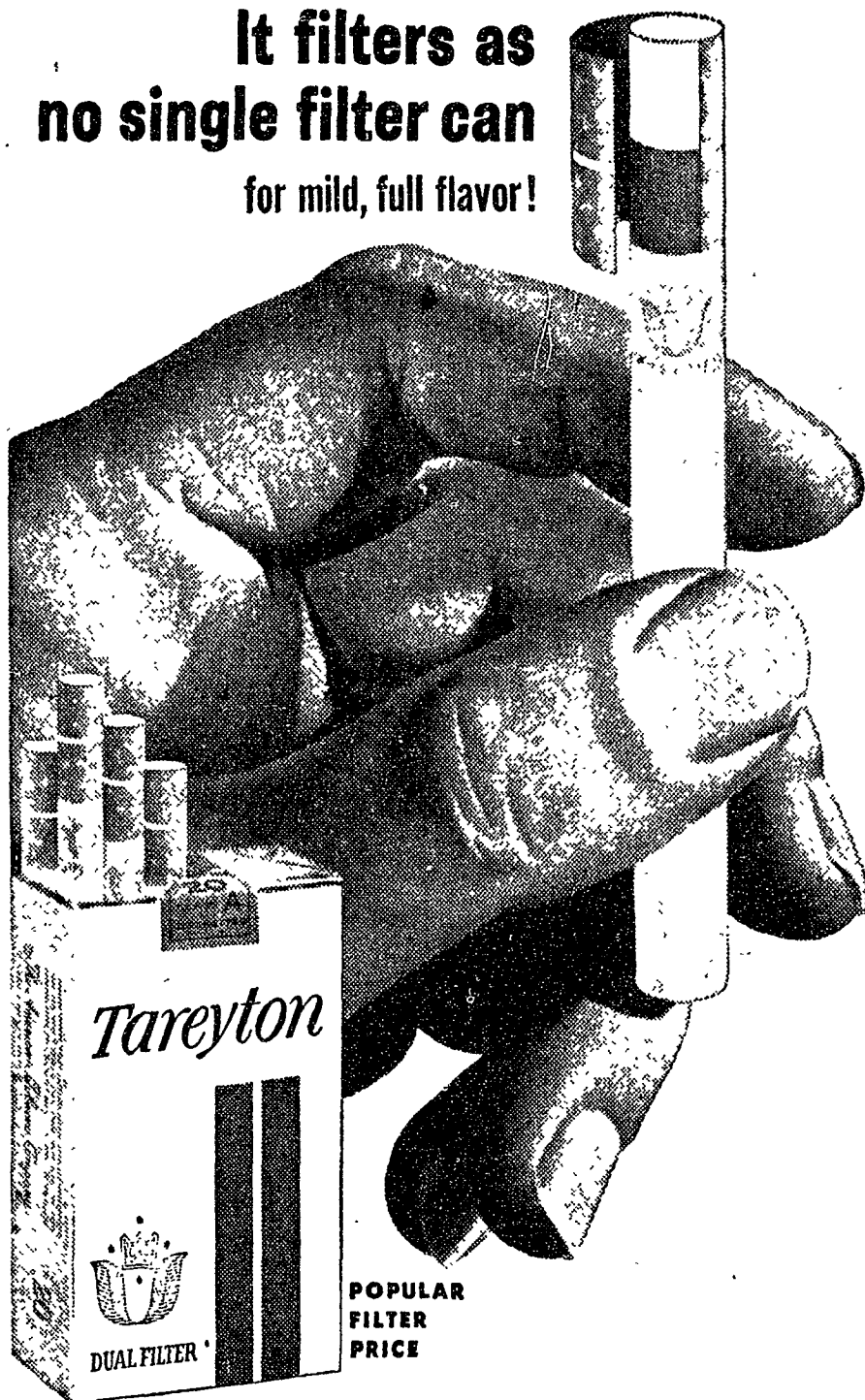
