

Low Bid Entered For Ed Building

G. M. McCrossin Inc of Bellefonte was the unofficial low bidder on two contracts involving a special education building on campus, the General State Authority said today.

The McCrossin bid amounted to \$14,477 for heating and \$9747 for plumbing.

If these bids are accepted, the total cost of the building would be \$99,974.
