

Chapel Choirs Will Present Bach Excerpts

The Meditation Chapel Choirs, directed by James Beach, will present excerpts from the Bach cantatas for its annual concert, plus four other special music programs during the spring semester.

Auditions for new members will be held 10-12 a.m. and 1:30-4 p.m. on Feb. 3, 4, and 5, and also from 7-9 p.m. Feb. 4 in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

For the spring concert, to be held at 8 p.m. May 3 in the chapel, the choir will sing excerpts from Bach's cantatas "Sleepers Wake" and "Lord Jesus Christ, Thou Font of Grace."

Buxtehude's canata "Jsu, Joy and Treasure," and "Five Mystical Songs" by Ralph Vaughan Williams will also be on the program.

The Lenten Concert, 8 p.m. March 29 in the chapel, and the Lenten Service of Music, 4:15 p.m. April 7 in the chapel, will include the singing of "Stabat Mater" by Antonio Caldara and the "Passion According to St. Matthew" by Victoria.

The choir will sing special music for the 10:55 Sunday services on April 10 in Schwab and also a special service of music 4:15 p.m. May 12 in the Chapel.

Journ Honorary Society Initiates Five Members

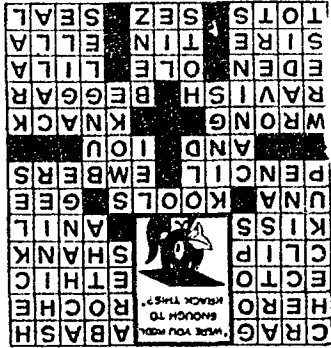

This is about the only time of the year when we are not swamped with sittings. Strange as it seems, final week is the ideal time to be photographed . . . especially if you're hard to please.

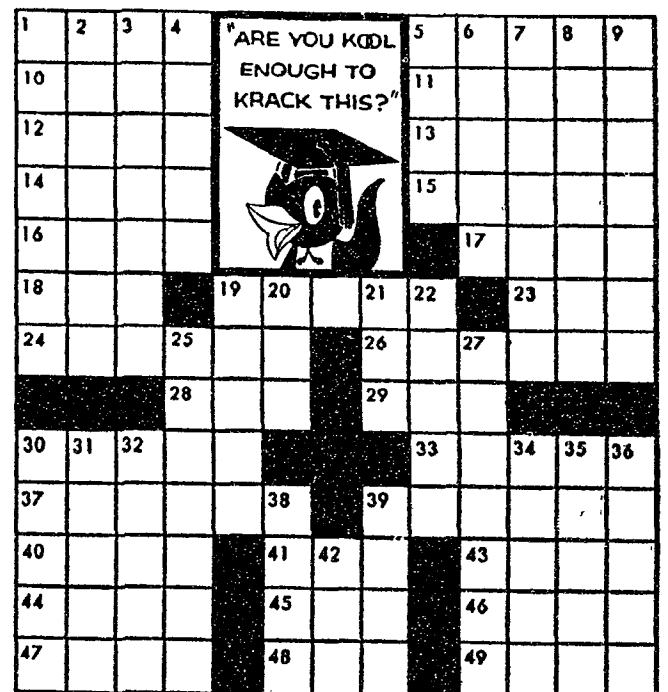
A sorority has asked us to photograph them in soft pastel sweaters. What a pleasant change.
