Chatt, English Chemist, Named Distinguished Visiting Professor

Dr. Joseph Chatt, of the Imperial Chemical Industries, Ltd., England, has been named distinguished visiting professor of chemistry for the spring semester.

While here Chatt will lecture on the chemistry of organometallic compounds, carbonyl, hydrocarbon and hydrio complexes, and the coordination compounds of the tertiary organic phosphines.

The program providing distinguished visiting professorships was established two years ago to enrich the University's educational program.

Chatt studied at Cambridge University, where he received both his bachelor's and doctor's degrees.

Shortly after the completion of

his academic training, Chatt was employed by Imperial Chemical Industries where he entered into extensive research on modern theoretical inorganic chemistry.

Chatt is past secretary of the Chemical Society of London and widely known as a lecturer. He also organized the now regular conference on coordination compounds sponsored by his laboratory. The next such conference is scheduled for 1961 in Detroit.

Chatt has published nearly 70 papers in professional journals, reporting his research.

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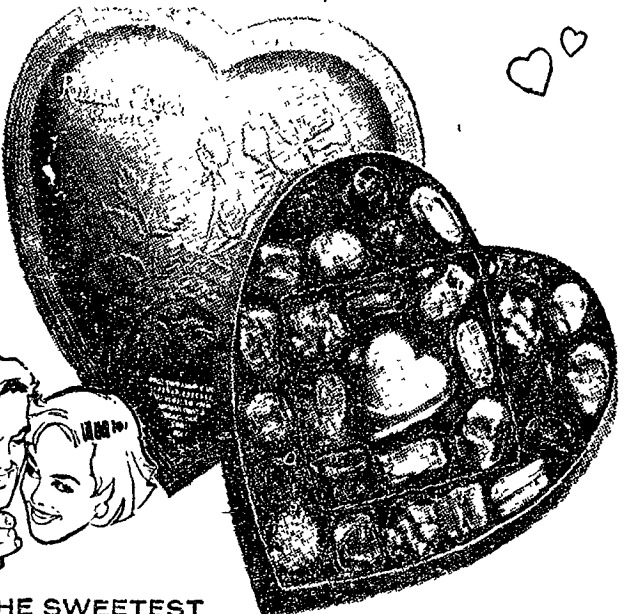
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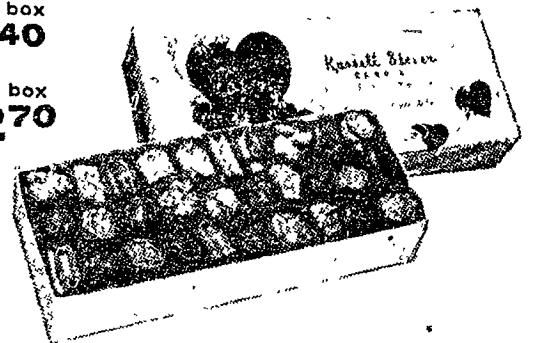
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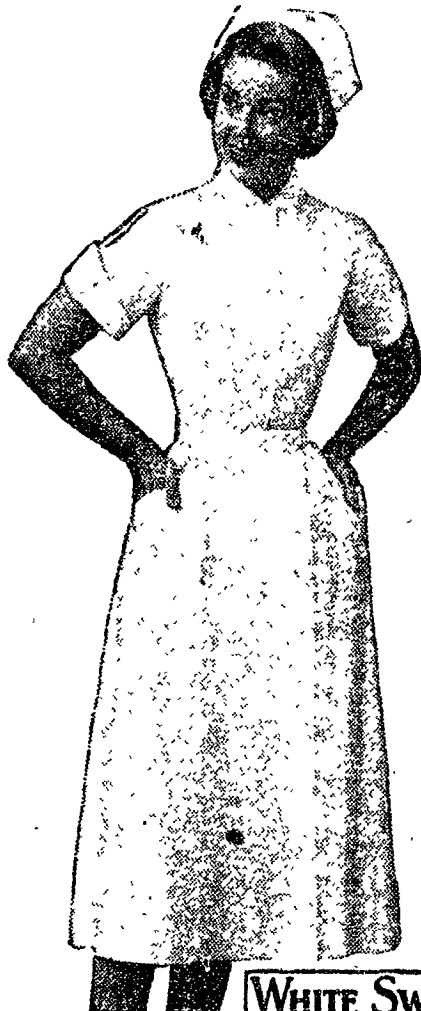
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
