

# Health Center Stresses Importance of Flu Shots

A total of 1042 flu shots were administered at the Ritenour Health Center during the month of January.

Although there has been a decrease of flu sickness at the infirmary since the exam period, Dr. Herbert R. Glenn, head of the Ritenour Health Center, continued to stress the importance of the shots at this time for each student.

## University to Offer NBC-TV Course

The University will again participate during the spring semester in the courses offered by Continental Classroom, the National Broadcasting Co. network television program for college credit.

Two courses are being taught, and both will be carried in this area on Channel 6, WJAC-TV, Johnstown.

Atomic Age Physics, taught by Dr. Harvey E. White of the University of California, will be telecast at 6 a.m. Monday through Friday. It will be devoted exclusively to nuclear and atomic physics.

Following this session, at 6:30 a.m., Modern Chemistry will be taught by Dr. John F. Baxter of the University of Florida. It will be concerned with radio-, electro-, and biochemistry and new kinds of equilibria.

The University will join approximately 200 colleges and universities throughout the country in making academic credit available for the programs.

Every person should receive a flu preventive shot annually and this is as good a time as any to get it, he said. Although some authorities feel the epidemic scare is subsiding, Glenn warns there is usually a danger of it until the middle of March.

The infirmary is well supplied with the vaccine, although it is becoming relatively scarce in many parts of the country, Glenn added. The shots are available at the dispensary during the regular hours.

Several specimens from the influenza cases treated at the infirmary have been sent to the Children's Hospital in Philadelphia. From these specimens, the hospital is able to determine the different strains of influenza which we have had here, Glenn said. This report, which is due at the end of the month, will aid the doctors in diagnosis and treatment in the future, he said.

# Soc Courses To Be Added

The Department of Sociology will expand its study program in the Fall of 1960 to include American Indian ethnology and archeology.

Four new courses were added to the program after Dr. William T. Sanders, a specialist in the archeology of Mexico, became a faculty member in the fall of 1959.

The department is also sponsoring a summer field project in Mexican archeology which will begin this summer. The project involves survey and excavations in the Valley Teotihuacan near Mexico City.

Students may enroll in one of two courses offered as part of the research program, archeology 20 on an undergraduate level or anthropology 521 on a graduate level.

Of the four new courses, archeology 403 will be the only one offered this spring. The course deals with ancient civilizations in Mexico and Peru.
