



Philatelic Collection On Display

Currently displayed in the Fred Lewis Pattee Library are portions of the collections of members of the Mt. Nittany Philatelic Society.

The display, which will continue through this month, includes examples of 19th century U.S. engraving art from the collection of Nelson Wood, research associate.

Wood said that the display demonstrates typical stamp collecting. "Collectors specialize in fields which interest them." As a former naval officer, Wood saves "ships on stamps."

Wood's collection is also represented by non-postage material, mostly World War I national and naval propaganda stamps from Germany, France, Britain and the United States.

Pre-cancelled stamps belonging to Doris M. Dodds, U.S. commemorative stamps and Swiss stamps are also displayed.

Wood, president of the State College chapter, said that the group meets at 7:30 p.m. on the first Thursday of each month in the junior high school cafeteria.

Tryouts for Musical Will End Tonight

Final tryouts for Cole Porter's Broadway musical "Kiss Me Kate," the Thespians' spring show, will be held from 7 to 9 tonight in 2 Carnegie.

The show will be presented the weekend of March 31, April 1 and 2.

Richard Mazza, director, said that dancers, singers and actors are needed for the production, and a stage crew will be selected. Musicians can also try out for the orchestra, and Raymond Fortunato, coordinator of the show, said there is a particular need for rehearsal pianists.

The sophisticated musical comedy is based on the idea of a "show within a show" as a group of young entertainers try to turn Shakespeare's "Taming of the Shrew" into a Broadway musical.

Mazza said that the male and female lead roles, Fred Graham and Lilly Venezia, and the role of a young entertainer, Lois Lane, require good voices. Along with singing ability, the role of Bill Calhoun, Lois Lane's partner, requires dancing ability.

The book "Kiss Me Kate" was written by Sam and Bella Spewack. Over 1000 performances were presented after it opened on Broadway in 1938.

Some of the more popular songs of the show are "So I Love," "Wunderbar," "Another Opening, Another Show," and "Brush Up Your Shakespeare."

Rosalee Samley, junior in arts and letters from Bethlehem, will do the choreography for the show, and the sets have been designed by Richard Frantz, a senior in architecture from State College.

The debaters will travel to St. Vincent's College, Latrobe, this weekend and King's College, Wilkes-Barre, the following weekend. Three weeks from now, they will participate in matches at Boston University, Mount Mercy College, Pittsburgh and the North-South Tournament at West Virginia.


