

Economy May Cause Center To Shut Down

(continued from page one) amending the bill to give us additional funds."

Walker said that some of the blame for the low appropriation lies in the political conflict between the urban and rural legislators and also in the fact that a new governor, who wasn't familiar with the University's aims, was inaugurated.

"There are two ways of securing funds — through gentle persuasion or high pressure tactics," Walker said, and the University follows the former.

He also outlined the areas in which an effort has been made to improve the quality of the staff and faculty as well as improvements which are in the process of being made. These included the superior teaching award, the visiting professor series, the general education courses, the year-around operation of the facilities, and the approval of honors programs.

"The balance sheets look good," Walker said in appraising the University's standing. Progress has been made and more progress is expected to improve the University's quality as an institution, he said. "Penn State is a great university and I am confident that it can be a distinguished one."

Department Of Security To Be Dropped

The Department of Security will be dissolved and its functions will be handled by other departments, Albert E. Diem, vice president for business administration, said yesterday.

Diem said the organizational change will be carried out gradually between now and July.

The Campus Patrol, formerly under the direction of the security department, will be established on a departmental basis and operated under the direct supervision of his office, Diem explained.

Safety inspection and coordination will be handled by the Department of Physical Plant Planning and Construction under the reassignment plan.

The security department's health physics function, which deals with radiation safety, will be transferred to the Health Center.

Workman's compensation claims will be handled by the Department of Personnel Services.

Diem said more economic and efficient operation was the primary reason for the changes.

Only about 50 per cent of Penn State's 15,000 students are housed in University facilities on the campus.

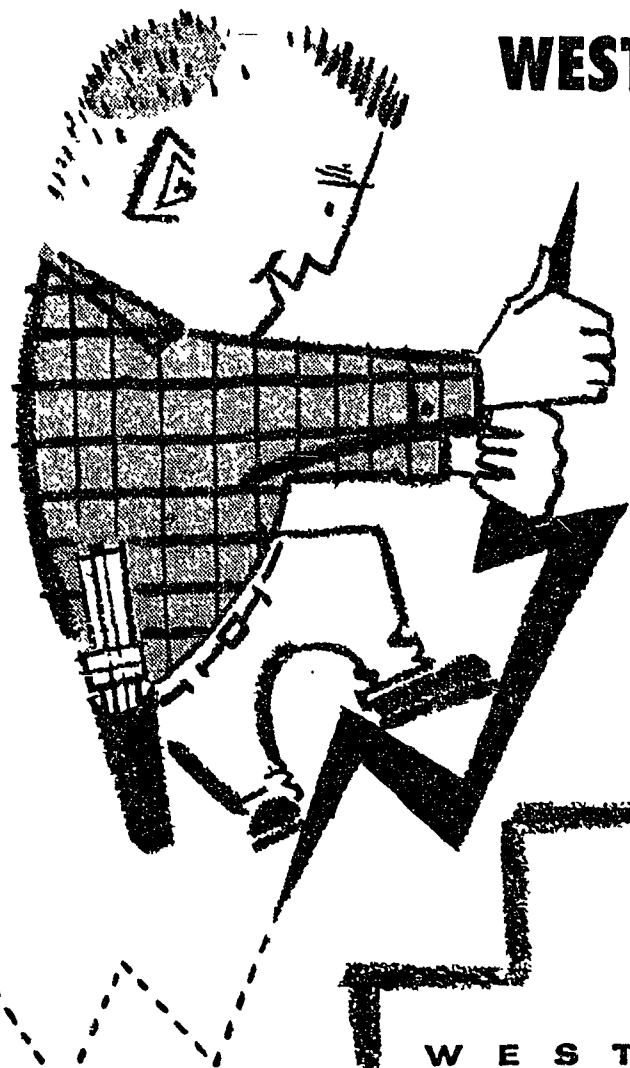
