

Individual Scoring Comparison Indicates Close Gym Contest

Penn State gymnastic Coach Gene Wettstone expects tomorrow's dual meet with Army to be so close that a minor break could very well determine the outcome of the meet.

A comparative rundown on the two unbeaten powers matching the highest scores attained by standout individuals this season shows the following:

Tumbling—John "Red" Seward, who upset national champ Dave Dulaney here last year, has scored a 268 and looks like a good bet to make it two straight.

Wettstone is hoping Jay Werner (246) will grab second spot from Army's Bill Chandler (240).

"I'd have to give Jay the benefit of the doubt here," said Wettstone. "He has what it takes and is overdue for a real good routine."

Side Horse — Sophomore Greg Weiss (260) and Cunningham (258) form a good one-two punch here but could get strong competition from Army's John Steele (254).

If Dave Palmer can complete his routine in the same fashion he did against Navy last Saturday when he garnered a 246 tally, he should beat the Cadets' Ralph Garens (238) and Steve Forte (225) for fourth place.

Horizontal Bar — Co-captains Cunningham (279) and Werner (254), and Weiss (268) will compete in this the Lions' strongest event.

Army's strongest competition should come from Bob Eckert (261).

Rope Climb — Army's Dave Hastings and John Kamerdeiner, together with Penn State's Vince Neuhauser lead the pack with a 3.8 time.

The Nittanians' Bob Mumau and Bill Fosnocht (both 3.9), and Army's Dick Yule (4.0) are right behind the three leaders in this bunched field.

Parallel Bars — Scorewise, this seems to be the Cadets' weakpoint. Ed Hendren's 246 is the best of the trio and shouldn't pose much of a threat to Weiss (270) for first

place.

Lee Cunningham's best score this season has been a relatively weak 223, but Wettstone believes the Lion co-captain, who has done upwards of 250 before this season, "has finally awakened."

"He didn't do well in the first two meets, but he went crazy in the last one (Navy)," the Lion mentor said.

Flying Rings — Expected to be a pressure-packed event because of its position on the program (last) and the indication of a close match the rings will feature a duel between Werner (281) and Jon Aaronsohn (278).

The two have clashed on three occasions with the Army junior beating Werner in last year's dual meet and the Easterns, and losing to him in the Nationals.

Jerry Schaeffer, talented sophomore performer, whose improvement reached a highpoint against Navy when he hit for 254, should battle Army's Bill Blitch (259) and Deuel (245) for third spot.

If these scores are an indication of the top places in each event, Wettstone could be right.

The University established one of its early two-year centers at DuBois, Pa. 25 years ago.

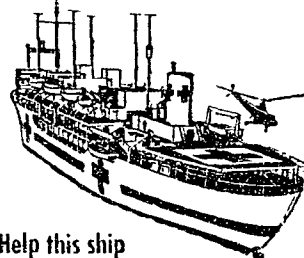
