

Wesley Group Will Sponsor Lecture Series

"From Friendship to Marriage," a 4-week series sponsored by the Wesley Foundation, will begin with a talk on "Campus Dating Patterns" at 6:30 p.m. Sunday at the Wesley Foundation.

Speaking will be Mrs Helen Buchanan, instructor in family relations. Her talk will feature particular aspects of the University social world.

A panel discussion on "One Love—Conflicting Faith" will continue the series Feb. 21. Participating will be clergy of the Catholic, Jewish, and Protestant faiths.

Dr Clifford Adams, professor of psychology, will speak on the physical aspects of married life as part of his topic, "Romance and Marriage" on Feb 28.

The final talk of the series will be given by Mr and Mrs. R Lester Anderson, graduate students, March 6. A discussion on the advantages and disadvantages of combining marriage and school will be included.

UBA Sales to End At Noon Saturday

More than 14,000 of the 19,000 books taken in by the student-run Used Book Agency in the HUB have been sold, according to Iris Pogal, personnel manager.


