TIM Continues Action Against Parking Ban

The Town Independent Men's Council will continue its action to lift the town parking ban on Saturday and Sunday mornings by making street maps suitable for parking and investigating the possibility of issuing TIM parking stickers.

Philip Haines, president of the council, told council members that the Borough Council has been influenced into opposing the plan by the current snow storm.

The members suggested that a map of State College be made with street, marked which would be suitable for parking and not interfere with cleaning or snow removal. They also suggested that town independent men be issued stickers so that police would be able to identify their cars.

Earl Gerishenow, George Finin, Frederick Phanco and James Rohrer were appointed to represent TIM on the Association of Independent Men's Board of Governors, and Ralph Levy was unanimously elected the new TIM treasurer.

A committee was also established to propose to Nittany Council that it work with TIM in having a booth and a float in Spring Week.

Oberteuffer spoke last night on "A Biological Basis for Responsibility in Education" in a lecture co-sponsored by the Graduate School Series and the College of Physical Education and Athletics.

An educator, Oberteuffer said, must understand the quality of the tissue that he expects to accept the learning. Studies of genetics, psychology and biology have proven that a student's ability to learn is based on his physiological and psychological makeup, he said.

Those who deny that the school's concern is with the intellect alone are reverting to 18th century ideas, he said. "You can't educate a mind alone; the mind doesn't exist alone."

We must pattern education in terms of man's capacity to take it," Oberteuffer said. "You can't expect performance from a machine that isn't built in to it."

We're doing fine with the science of things, he said, now we have to apply what we know to human problems. We have to provide activities, concern and instruction that will give the student his best chance to react to the best kind of education.

Carson Ruled Not Eligible For SGA Seat

Freshman Class President Robert Carson has been declared scholastically ineligible to sit on SGA Assembly.

A second semester freshman, Carson is affiliated with University party. An alternate from this party will be appointed by Assembly chairman Larry Byers, to fill the vacancy.

A 2.4 All-University average is required to keep an Assembly seat.

However, Carson will remain in the capacity of class president and advisor to the Freshman Class Advisory Board since the 2.4 requirement does not apply to the position of class officer itself.

The Advisory Board has decided that an executive council member shall be required to have a 2.2 scholastic average instead of a 2.4 as was required in the past.

The Board also declared that the SGA bylaw stating that if an officer becomes scholastically ineligible, the order of succession shall be from chairman to secretary-treasurer does not apply to the board.

The date for the freshman class dance has been set for April 22. Entertainment, refreshments and decoration committees were formed. Hershel Richman was appointed chairman of the entertainment committee.
