Divinity School Prof to Speak At Chapel Service in Schwab

Dr. Prentiss L. Pemberton, professor of social ethics and sociology of religion at the Colgate - Rochester Divinity School, will preach the sermon on "Christian Obedience" at the University Chapel service of worship at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

The Chapel Choir, under the direction of Willa Taylor, will sing "O Lord of Hosts, All Heavens Possessing" by Bach, as choral introit. "Sanctus" from the Requiem Mass by Mozart will be the morning anthem.

University organist George E.

Ceiga will play "Psalm One Hundred" by Howells to open the service; "If Thou But Suffer God to Guide Thee" by Peeters as the offertory; and "Canzona Post il Commuio" by Frescobaldi to close the service.

Pemberton received his undergraduate degrees from the Ottawa University in Kansas and the Andover Newton Theological Seminary. He holds a doctor of philosophy degree from Harvard University.
