Exchange Plan For Librarians Begun Here

Exchange programs are no novelty to the University—professors, students and now librarians are sent to other universities for work and study.

Miss Eleanor Chong, research assistant, is currently working at the Fred Lewis Pattee Library while Mrs. Margaret Monico occupies her position as document librarian at the University of Hawaii.

This is the first such exchange for each university.

Miss Chong has worked in the Pattee library since September and will remain until August. She said that she had become interested in the switch because she wanted to try some other type of library work.

She also wanted to visit the United States again. Miss Chong received her masters degree in library science from the University of Illinois and took her bachelor of arts degree at the University of Hawaii.

Miss Chong said that the University of Hawaii library is much smaller than the library here because the student body is about one-third the size.

She added that there are no departmental libraries at the University of Hawaii. All their 290,000 bound volumes are housed in one building.

Fellowships For LibSci Available

Seniors enrolled in the Department of Library Science may obtain work-study fellowships at the University of Michigan for the year June 16, 1960, to June 15, 1961.

To be eligible, they must have gained admission to the Horace H. Rackham School of Graduate Studies as degree candidates in library science.

The stipend given is \$3000 paid in 12 installments starting July 5. The library will pay the student's fees for the year. The appointment may be renewed once.

The student will be scheduled for 32 hours of work a week in the library. He will be given an annual vacation allowance of 20 working days, plus one day sick leave a month.

Deadline for applications is April 1. Announcement of the recipient will be made about May 1.

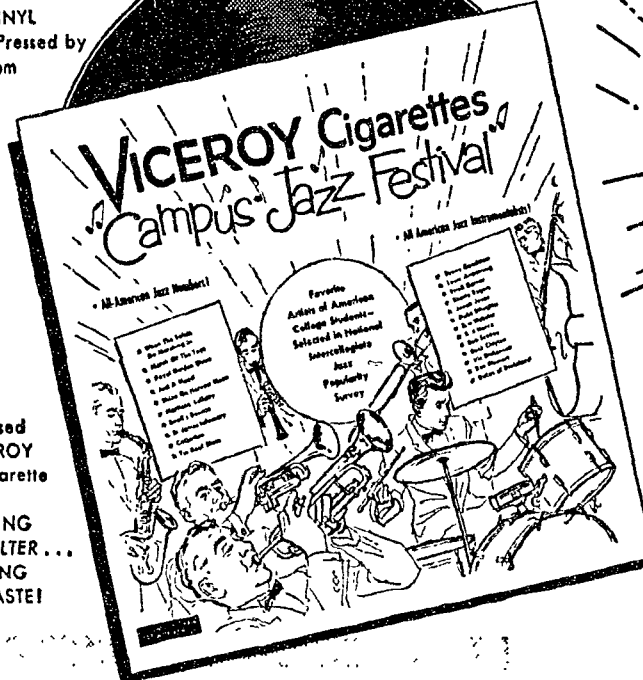
