STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES These policies have been designed to provide a maximum of freedom, a maxi-mum of personal responsibility, and only enough regulation to establish the orderly living of women students in residence. The success of their operation is completely dependent upon the integrity of women students. Personal growth in responsibility and integrity is an important goal of higher education. Only in rare cases would a student need to request an extension beyond 11:30 pm for such an "occasional event" Such a request should be discussed with a residence hall staff member in advance "Continuing Occasions" Sometimes a student becomes in-volved in some campus activity which requires late-hour participation on a continuing basis. MEN'S CALLING HOURS Men may be entertained in public places of the residence hall (i.e. lounge, recreation room) 'from 12 noon until the required sign-in hour of his date, when he is expected to leave.
 Betore 12 noon men will be expected to remain in the lobby.

IN THE RESIDENCE HALLS WOMEN students are expected at all times to maintain high social standards and r. consideration for other residents. The residence hall should be regarded as a woman's home which is shared by many. For this reason residence regu-lations are established not for disci-pline but for well-ordered hying in the best interests of all Kceping quiet during the hours when G people are likely to be studying or sleeping and respecting other's needs and habits are essential to the main-tenance of a conducive study atmos-phere for all. IN THE RESIDENCE HALLS WOMEN

At no time should a woman's conduct with a man violate good taste or be embairassing to others.

embarrassing to others. Bermuda shorts, kilts, and slacks are considered suitable attine for resi-dence hall entertaining, for breakfast, lunch and Sunday supper during the semester, and for all meals during finals except Sunday noon dinner and special dinners. However, they are not appropriate in administrative buildings and offices nor for evening meals during the sene-ter and Sunday noon dinnet. dinner,

Women students are expected to weat heels and hose to Sunday noon dinner Sweatshnits, bluegeans, khakigeans, short shorts, yvm sunts, bandanas, pincurls, and curlets are not considered appro-priate attire for the dining hall.

Women students are expected to dress appropriately when in the public places of residence halls during men's calling hours, for example, no housecoats, it is generally not considered ap-unversity authorities.

propriate for women to smoke while walking across campus or through the hallways of my building Student's private rooms, lounges, recreation rooms and the dining hall are con-sidered appropriate places for those who wish to smoke In other public buildings a student should be guided by the acceptable practness of that building

IF, AT ANY TIME, THE BEHAVIOR IF, AT ANY TIME, THE BEHAVIOR of a woman in a residence hall is imappropriate to the maintenance of a refined atmosphere or detrimental to the other residents, she makes heiself hable to disciplinary action by Judi-cial Committee of WSGA or by the University Faculty-Student Committee on Disculture.

on Discipline. Guests are held responsible for their actions and, as such subject to action by the appropriate authorities.

THE STUDENT GOVERNING BODY of a particular residence hall may find it necessary to establish special rules and policies to be applied to the hall which they govern. Such rules and policies shall be subject to re-view by WSGA at any time.

WOMEN STUDENTS ARE REMINDED

WOMEN STUDENTS ARE REMINDED of the University policy on drinking;
W-1 Possession or use of alcoholic beverages on University property, and maintenance of bais, dispens-ing equipment, or similar facilities for storing or serving alcoholic beverages in any student or social unit are prohibited
W-5 The Senate Committee on Student Affairs shall hold student organ-izations responsible for the good conduct of all persons at all Uni-versity related functions, and for conformance to the laws of the Borough, Commonwealth, and Na-tion. Any individual or organiza-tion whose conduct is found to be prejudicial to the good name of the University will be subject to dis-cuplication Such action may include supension or expulsion of individuals, or the suspension or revocation of the charters of organizations. organizations.


