Poor Shooting Ruins Lehigh As Nittanies Capture 10th Win

U.S. Hockey Team Stuns Canada, 2-1

Lehigh's Engineers could have used a few slide rules to find the basket last night.

Almost inept from the field for three-quarters of the ball game, the Engineers had trouble mounting an offensive attack and Penn State breezed to a 76-58 win in the season's finale at Rec Hall.

A small, but appreciative crowd of 1500 saw Penn State roll up its 10th win against nine losses. Lehigh is 5-15.

The issue was never in doubt as the Lions jumped into an early seven-point lead and extended it to 12 at the half, 33-21.

Finding Penn State's zone tighter than a telephone booth in the springtime, Lehigh was forced to take poor shots throughout the first half. They canned just seven baskets the whole time.

Mark DuMars broke things wide open midway in the second half when he connected for 10 straight points in 2½ minutes to give State a 60-39 bulge with eight minutes left.

After Jake Trueblood's jumper made it 64-42 Penn State coach John Egli yanked his starting five.

And that's when Lehigh began to knock the score down. Norm Brandl, the 11th leading scorer in the nation, hit for nine points with the Lion subs in and the Engineers came within 14, 70-56.

Egli then put DuMars back in the lineup and the little "magician" scored four straight to wrap up the win.

DuMars was State's top scorer

with 25 points. Following him was Bill Saul with 13, Jake Trueblood with 12 and captain Wally Colender 10.

Brandl, who was averaging 24.8 points a game, narrowly missed hitting that mark and finished with 22. Bob Happ and Barry Lindenbaum had 12 apiece for the Engineers.

Lehigh hit 35 per cent which doesn't seem that bad, but they made a lot of their shots in the closing minutes when it was too late.

The Lions now have three games left and will play Pitt at the Pitt Field House tomorrow

night. They'll close out the season next weekend with games at Temple and Rutgers.
