

# DuMars Returns 'Home' PhiK Sig Posts IM Swim Win As Cagers Meet Panthers

Mark DuMars returns to the scene of some of his greatest performances tonight when Penn State (10-9) meets Pitt (10-13) in the Pitt Field House.

It was in the Field House in 1957 that DuMars led Sharon High School to the Western Pennsylvania Championship and from there Sharon went on to cop the state title.

Penn State's DuMars now one of the leading scorers in the nation with a 21.8 average, was the big gun as Sharon swept past such powers as 1956 state champ Farrell, Oliver High of Pittsburgh and undefeated McKeesport.

He was at his best against McKeesport, scoring 22 points as Sharon broke the Tigers' 24-game winning streak.

But he didn't do it alone. He got plenty of help from one John Fridley who will be in the Pitt lineup tonight.

Any time the Panthers and State get together in Pittsburgh, the town of Sharon turns out en masse to watch their two favorite sons battle it out.

Last year a bus caravan saw DuMars, then a sophomore, play Pitt's great All-American Don Hennon to a standstill. Fridley had a good night too and was the game's leading rebounder.

Tonight's game will be the second of the season between the two teams. State beat Pittsburgh in a wild and wooly affair, 75-64, last month in Rec Hall.

Despite their sub .500 record, the Panthers have been extremely tough at home this year, losing only to such powers as West Virginia, Navy, and NYU.

Penn State, on the other hand, hasn't been a "road" team. They've only copped two games away from Rec Hall—at Bucknell and Carnegie Tech.

State will be depending heavily on the outside shooting of DuMars and captain Wally Colender tonight in an effort to upset the Panthers.

Joining the two backcourt stars in the starting lineup, will be Bill Saul, Jack Trueblood and Paul Sweetland.

Pitt will counter with little Billy

Mauro and Dick Falenski in the backcourt, high-scorer John Mills at center, and Fridley and Bob Sankey up front.

After tonight's game, Penn State closes out the season with road games at Temple and Rutgers next weekend. Pitt will end its season next Saturday at Kentucky.

Led by the swimming and diving efforts of Lee Cunningham, Phi Kappa Sigma splashed to a 25-16 intramural victory over Delta Tau Delta last night. Cunningham captured the diving honors with 19.6 and finished second in the 60-yard breaststroke.

Finishing one-two in all events except the breaststroke, Phi Kappa Psi trounced Sigma Alpha Mu, 33-8. Although Phi Psi failed to gain any double winners their team balance proved too much for an undermanned Sammy squad.

The times of both meets were relatively high with the swimmers showing signs of tiring after the first lap. Only in the 60-yard freestyle where Bob

MacDonnell of Phi Psi raced to a 34.3 finish was a fast time recorded.

Delta Tau Delta swam away from Phi Kappa Sig in the 120-yard medley relay. The Delts relay team composed of George Bowman, Dick Whittaker, Charles Richardson and Delle Kreiser was clocked at 1:07.3.

The Delts managed to finish second and third in the 60-yard free style but Jim Schwab of Phi Kappa Sig took first by one stroke over Sam Bowman of the Delts. Schwab's time was 35.4.

In a slow back stroke, Dick Murphy of Phi Kappa Sig outlasted the Delts' George Campbell while Jim Mason finished third for Phi Kappa Sig. The winning time was 45.5.

Cunningham was never pressed for the diving victory as his near-

est competitor, Earl Wolfe of the Delts, scored 13.8 to Cunningham's 19.6.

With Tom Pauley finishing first and Bob Passmore second for Phi Psi in the backstroke along with a one-step sweep in the freestyle SAM was never really in close competition.

Phi Psi added a first and third finish in the breaststroke with Jay MacMullan and Bill Russ doing the scoring. Steve Zitin of Sammy came from behind to capture second place.

Tom Bryan more than tripled the points of his nearest opponent to win the diving with a 16.1 score.

The relay team of MacDonnell, Dick Taranto and Pauley added the final five points to the Phi Psi total.

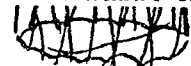
