

Cagers Meet Owls, Kennedy Tonight

All eyes will be on Mark DuMars and Bill Kennedy tonight in Philadelphia when Penn State (10-10) meets Temple (16-8) in the second half of a Palestra twin-bill Penn and Cornell play the first game at 7:30.

Kennedy, a two year All-American and a great favorite of the Philly fans, will be playing his final regular season game in a Temple uniform.

He's had a great career as a playmaker and scorer during his three-year stint for Coach Harry Litwack.

Going into tonight's game Kennedy is the fourth highest scorer in Temple history behind Hal Lear, Guy Rodgers and Bill Mlky.

He's got an outside chance to become number one, but it will take a 44-point scoring spree to do it.

Kennedy won't have the spotlight all to himself, though He'll have to share it with another little man, State's DuMars.

The 5-10 Penn Stater has been called the best backcourt man in the East and he'd like nothing

better than to prove it to the Philly fans.

Averaging 21.9 points a game, DuMars, along with captain Wally Colender, has carried the Penn State offense all season long.

DuMars is well known to Owl rooters, because of his work

As a sophomore, DuMars scored 21 points while holding Kennedy to eight, but Kennedy got even in the Keystone Classic this season, outscoring the Lion star 21-20.

Kennedy himself is one of DuMars' greatest fans. "He's real good and has a terrific shot. I think he'll make All-American.

Maybe not this year, but definitely next," says Pickles. DuMars will start out front to-

night with his sidekick Colender Paul Sweetland at center and Jake Trueblood and Bill Saul at forwards round out the starting five.

For Temple it will be Kennedy and soph star Bruce Drysdale in the backcourt. Russ Gordon, who was the MVP in the Keystone Classic, is the center while Earl Proctor and Ed Devery will start up front.

The Owls, winners in six of their last seven games, still have a chance for the NIT tournament but it's slight and they must win tonight by a convincing score.

Penn State will wind up its season tomorrow night in New Brunswick, N.J. against Rutgers. The Lions beat Rutgers 96-61 earlier this year in Rec Hall.

Grifa Heads Strong Rutgers' Mat Team

Unbeaten Tom Grifa, Rutgers' 147-pound co-captain, leads a strong Scarlet wrestling team which hosts Penn State tomorrow at New Brunswick, N.J., in the final dual meet of the season for both clubs.

Grifa, a senior and three-year veteran boasts a 20-meet winning streak and has lost only one of 29 matches in his career.

Hawthorne is the probable starter at 157, while Jim Sierk fills the 177-pound slot. John Nacisco holds down the assignment at 191.

Juniors Fred Leich, 130, and Jim Horner, heavyweight, are expected to be in the starting lineup while sophomores fill the remaining slots.

Bob Hogan, 123, Dick Janish, 130, and Carl Skuba, 167, are the probable sophomore starters. Four of the Scarlet starters reached the advanced rounds of the EIWA tourney last year and each lost to the eventual champion or place-winner.

Hawthorne reached the quarter-finals where he lost an overtime decision to Cornell's Steve Friedman, the title winner.

Sierk lost to Lehigh's Ed Hamer eventual 177-pound eastern and 167-pound national champ. Horner was edged by Art Baker, Syracuse's eastern and national titleholder.

In reaching the finals, Grifa knocked off Les Austin of Syracuse.

Grifa heads a well-balanced Scarlet crew, consisting of four seniors, two juniors and three soph.

Seniors are expected to man the 147, 157, 177, and 191-pound berths. Grifa will be at 147. Ed
