

Panhel Open Bid System To Go Into Effect Friday

The open bidding system of Panhellenic Council rushing will begin Friday.

Any coed who registered for spring rushing and who did not join a sorority during formal rushing is eligible for a bid.

Rushees may visit sorority suites and rooms at any time.

and may be visited in their rooms. While socializing between rushees and sorority women is unlimited, no oral bids may be extended. This will be considered as a rushing violation and the offending sorority will be penalized.

Mrs. Norma Mountan, assistant to the dean of women and sorority advisor, must be notified 24 hours before a sorority extends an open bid to a rushee. The bid must be written.

The rushee receiving the bid must answer it within seven days and then return it to 105 Old Main. During the time between the issuance of the bid and the time the rushee is ribboned, a strict silence will be observed by the sorority and the rushee involved.

The strict silence is stipulated in order to avoid any pressure being placed on the rushee that has received a bid, Mrs. Mountan said.
