

### Science Papers To Be Given In Competition

The Penn State Branch of the Institute of Aeronautical Sciences will hold its annual Student Paper Competition at 7 tonight in 105 Mechanical Engineering.

Five seniors in aeronautical engineering will present four research papers. The audience will judge the papers to determine who will represent the University in regional competitions. The first competition will be held in Dallas, Texas.

Students and their topics are Ronald Nutter, "Man in Space—the Human Factor"; John Castor, "A Comparison Between Circular Arc and Flapped Thin Plate Trifolds"; Richard Wible, "A Design Method for STOL Aircraft"; and David Miller and Henry Mazor, "Thrust Characteristics in Ground Effect of a Model Ground Effect Machine with a 45 Degree Inclined Annular Jet."
