Scott worked there for five years in industrial plants and mastered the language. The great purge of 1937 forced him, along with thousands of other foreigners from Soviet industry. He stayed on in Moscow for three years as a correspondent for French and British newspapers.

In 1940 and 1941, Scott made two long trips through the Balkans, the Middle East and Asiatic Russia, writing reports which attracted attention in many countries.

Western officials formally handed over their plan to the five Communist delegations at a preconference meeting last night.

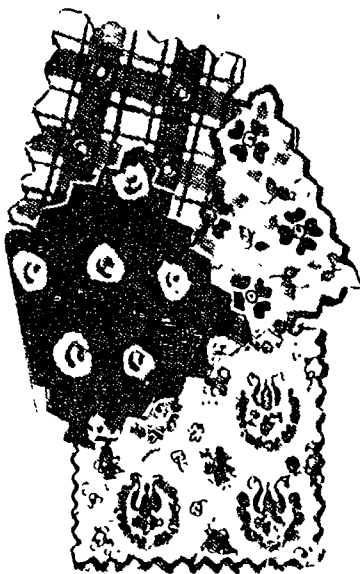
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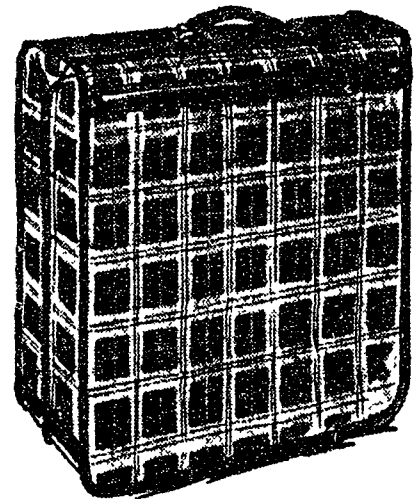
